## Gail via Snyder. At Once

### PRESSREPORTS

#### Are That Deal Is Made and Road Is Coming to Gail, via Snyder Whoo'er Up

Below we give clippings to the effect that the Rock Island has purchased the Texas Central railroad and that same will be extended west to Gail via Snyder.

This is by far the most encouraging railroad news that we have ever had. The Central-Rock Island would connect us directly with the wholesale centers of the State and would be one of the very best lines that we could possibly secure.

Gail is anxious for this road and will meet any reasonable demand made by the company. We are only awaiting a proposition and when it comes we will be ready and willing to do our part.

Railroad connection means more to Gail than anything else and we are pleased to report our prospects excellent. The dispatches follow:

The daily press reports the sale of the Texas Central R. R. Co. This will mean the connecting of the Rock Island at Stamford with the Central, and then starting at Rotan, the road will be built to Snyder, Gail and on to the Plains. You may expect to hear something "drap" in the Central Rock Island extension in a short time.—Snyder Western Light.

The Rock Island is building west from Jacksboro, but its prospective terminus is unknown though some believe Stamford or Sweetwater. The Texas Central is to extend west from Rotan to a destination now a secret but thought to be Gail, Borden county, via Snyder.—Dallas News.

The paths of civilization have been blazed by those who lived that others might find a better way and to them we turn for inspirations beckoning hand. The mind loves to dwell on the beauties of unselfish devotion and the laurel wreath is placed by loving hands

on those who have heeded the call. While each of these noble men of the kingdom of God will be missed yet have they left a golden heritage to the race and life is made better by their having lived.—Lubbock Avalanche.
