Railroad connection means more to Gail than anything else und we are pleased to report our prospects excellent. The dispatches follow:
The dailv press reports the sale of the Texas Central R. R. Cu. Thie will meal the conneeting of the Rock Island at stamford with the Central, and then starting at Rotan, the road will be buil to Snyder, Gail and on to the Plains. You may expect to hear something "drap" in the Central Rock Island ex tension in a ahort time. - Snyder Weatern Light.
The Rock Island is building west from Jacksboro, but ite prospective termiaus is unknown though some believe Stamford of Sweetwater. The Texas Central is to extend west from Ro$\tan$ to destination now a se. cret but thought to be Gail, Borden county, via Snyder.-Dallae News.
