for producers and submits them to the TRRC: Dunn said she knows of one company with bonds in Oklahoma for its wells there but their bonding firm won't cover their Texas operations.
She said Texas law requires bonding companies to resolve any differences within 30
days - a time frame she says the companies don't like.
Also, she said, the bonds in Texas never expire, another factor not in the bonding companies' favor.
"It looks like the bonding companies only want a limited liability," Dunn said. "To me,
(the bond requirement law) is a kind of crush-(the-little-guy sort of thing."

Now that folks are trying to scare us

hands on one. Iraq. Iran and North Korea hands on one. Iraq, Iran and North Korea
don't have any nuclear warheads. If left alone, they could make them, but I doubt they will try. Having one or two nukes is practically useless. They
mainly suicide weapons.

I'm not asking you to believe that the heads of these states have hearts of gold and benign outlooks. No, you can count on something far more certain than that? They are all sane, and they are all very
much interested in their own selfish much interested in their own selfish
interests.'And getting yourself and your country turned into molten glass is in nobody's self-interest.

## Report offers insight into undocumented immigrants

Almost a quarter of people working in private households
in the United States are illegal immigrants, as are about half in the United States are illegal immigrants, as are about half
the country's farmworkers and 9 percent of its restaurant employees, a report says.
The analysis by the nonpartisan Pew Hispanic Center offers a detailed look at the nation's illegal immigrants, estimated at almost 8 million people, and demonstrates how much certain
industries rely on the country's approximately 5.3 million industries rely on the country's approximately 5.3 millio
undocumented workers. The report comes as President Bush was scheduled to trav-
el to U.N. development conference in Mexico on Thursday. He was also expected to meet with Mexican President Vicente Fox to discuss immigration, among other issues. Immigration advocates hoped the leaders would resume negotiations on legalizing undocumented immigrants and
expanding a temporary worker program that allows Mexicans expanding a temporary worker program that
to cross the border into the United States.
Federal prosecutors have accused at least one corporation of conspiring to smuggle illegal immigrants to work at the company's food processing plants in nine states, including Texas.

The report estimated Mexicans make up 58 percent of the undocumented population, while Central Americans account
for about a fifth.
The estimates illustrate that "the idea of creating a program to legalize the unauthorized work force is an endeavor of enormous scope, and significantly larger than the last go-
around," said Roberto Suro, director of the research group, around," said Roberto Suro, director of the research group,
referring to a 1986 amnesty that granted legal status to almost referring to a 1986 amnesty that granted legal status to almost
3 million undocumented immigrants. Suro said the economy's growth in demand for unauthorized workers,
The report relies on such information as census figures, Immigration and Naturalization Service data, and employment estimates for various industries.
It estimated that 24 percent of private household workers, including maids and nannies, are undocumented.
Seventeen percent of those in the business services indusSeventeen percent of those in the business services indus-
try, which includes maintenance workers and employees in
mailing houses, advertising and credit reporting companies,
are undocumented. The report also said 6 percent of those in
construction and manufacturing are undocumented.
Agriculture relies most heavily on undocumented workers -47 percent of the 2.5 million U.S. farmworkers are undocumented, according to the report.

## TDH: Understanding meningitis can help keep it from spreading

AUSTIN - Meningococcal menin-
gitis is a rare disease in the United
States, usually occurring as isolated cases. And while it is contagious, it is
cole not as contagious as the common cold or the flu according to Dr. Kate Hendricks, director of the Infectious Disease Epidemiology and Surveillance Division at the Texas Department of
Health (TDH). "People cannot get it just Health (TDH). "People cannot get it just
by being in the same room for a few hours with someone who has it." Reports of even isolated cases of
meningitis can create public concern. But understanding the illness, its sympoms and method of transmission can help ease worries and he
infections, Hendricks said.
infections, Hendricks said.
Anywhere from 100 to 250 people a year in Texas will get meningocóccal cases occurring in late winter and early spring. In 2000, 146 cases were reported in the state, with nine deaths.
Preliminary figures from TDH show 173 cases in 2001 with 16 deaths. The illness. an infection of the layers
of tissue covering the brain and spinal cord, is caused by the bacterium Neisseria meningitidis. The infection is spread through sneezing or coughing directly in someone's face, kissing, sharing eating or drinking utensils or in other ways that allow saliva or respiratory droplets from an infected person to get
intó the mouth or nose of another person.

should see a doctor immediately, Hendricks said. "It can be lifesaving. Also, an infant with a fever of 101 degrees or higher and who is not easily wakened should be seen by a doctor." People with meningococcal meningi-
tis also may be confused or drowsy and tis also may be confused or drowsy and
sometimes may go into a coma from which they cannot be awakened. Those with the illness must be hospitalized and treated with antibiotics.
"Family members or close contacts will usually be advised to take antibiotics to reduce their risk of getting
meningitis," Hendricks said.

About 10 percent to 20 percent of infected people die, many within hours of the first symptoms. Others may suffer complications such as brain damage,
blindness, loss of hearing, kidney failure or amputations. With proper treatment however, many people recover fully. The bacteria lives in the noses and ing people sick. The incubation period ing people sick. The incubation period,

cultural events when meningitis occurs in the community. "The risk is very small in those settings because transmis sion of the bacteria requires very close exposure," Hendricks said.
A vaccine that protects against four strains of meningococcal meningitis is available for people over age 2 but is not
routinely given in the United States. It is not helpful for treating close contacts of cases because it takes at least two weeks for the protection to begin. In addition, the vaccine's protection lasts only a few years; and if a person ever needs to be vaccinated again, the immune system may not respond as well the second

## Blood test could be key in predicting Alzheimer's

That might eventually become possible by testing for homocysteine and a bad gene that doubles the risk of Alzheimer's, plus reviewing a patient's family history of longevity and Alzheimer s, said Dr. Sudah Seshadri, a study.
Previous studies have shown people with Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia have han other pers of homocysteine in their blood document high levels in people years before they developed Alzheimer's.
Homocysteine levels can be lowered by getting more folic acid and related B vitamins
Scientists said more research is needed to show Scientists said more research is needed to show
whether lowering homocysteine levels can, in fact, ward off Alzheimer's.

## Scientists eyeball gene linked to hair loss

NEW YORK (AP) - In a finding that but it fails to regrow after being shaved, as may someday help scientists understand they've identified a normal role for a gene that causes two rare hair-loss disorders when it's disabled.
So far, even with the new work, there's no evidence of a direct link between the "hairless" gene and typical baldness. In
fact, the new work doesn't even explain why the gene causes the rare hair-loss dis orders when it malfunctions
But many types of hair loss probably share a similar biological mechanism, and understanding the hairless gene's function will help scientists figure that mechanism Thompson.
Thompson, from the Kennedy Krieger Research Institute and the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine in Baltimore, and colleagues report their study of the hairless gene in a recent issue of th journal Genes and Development. who inherit a malfunctioning version of hairless can get an extreme form of a con dition called alopecia universalis, in which yebrows, eyelashes and body hair fail

The Framingham study has uncovered key isk factors for heart disease by following several thousand people in the Massachusetts community with check-ups and surveys about
their diet, exercise, smoking and other habits. their diet, exercise, smoking and other habits.
Seshadri and colleagues examined data from checkups on the 1,092 people in the late 1980s and eight years before, including their homocysteine levels and neurological exam showing they did not have Alzheimer's. The
patients, now 76 on average, were followed patients, now
through 2000.
By then, 83 had been dianoed with By then, 83 had been diagnosed with
Alzheimer's and 28 others hat dementia.
The 25 percent with the highest homocys teine levels were 1.9 times more likely to have

## Texas cattle likely to lose tuberculosis-free label

USDA downgrade to mean widespread testing and tagging DALLAS (AP) - Federal officials plan to trip the Texas cattle industry of its tuberculo-is-free status, a move that livestock produccosts and make it harder to sell their animals. As part of the downgrade, the U.S. Agriculture Department is expected to require widespread testing and tagging of Texas cattle
