None of the Middle Eastern men identified by the Arizona counterterrorism agents or any information contained in their July 2001 memo pointed to the suicide plot that leveled the
World Trade Center and killed Washington and Pennsylvania, officials said.

After the suicide attacks, the FBI quickly descended upon
flight schools nationwide, identifying academies in Florida, Arizona and elsewhere where the leaders of the 19 hijackers
