Town marks 90th anniversary of mass murder that saw 8 die

the anniversary of the state's longest-unsolved whodunit - additions that organizers of a weekend retrospective hope will help residents better understand tit
ing that followed.
The brutal facts were these: On June 9, 1912 businessman J.B. Moore was slain with an ax along with his wife and cheir four children. Also house that night.
They were killed by a man believed to have slipped into the home and hid in the attic while
the family was attending Sunday evening church services.
The news quickly spread through town and The news quickly spread through town and
its 2,000 inhabitants, triggering hysteria and its 2,000 inhabitants, triggering hysteria and
fear. People boarded up windows and attached a fear. People boarded up windows and attached a
second set of lock bolts to doors. Neighbors shared nightly watch duty and the National Guard was called in to restore order The story briefly captivated the nation, a
dozens of reporters converged to file stories that dozens of reporters converged to file stories that
bumped news of the Titanic sinking from the front pages of major metropolitan newspapers. "It was the kind of thing that was unheard of at the time for a small rural town in lowa," said
Judy Schroeder, who is helping organize the anniversary. "People came here from all ove lowa and the country to just see, people on hors
es, in cars, wagons stuffed with so many peopl that they were hanging over the edge.
A lengthy and controversial investigation followed, involving a renowned pack of blood-

## Being taxpayers vs. prisoners

 It didn't come as a surprise to me toread the other day that 67 percent of for-
mer inmates released from state prison in
1994 were arrested again within three
years, up from more than 62 percent in
1983.
That's a according to the Justice
Department's Bureau of Justice Statistics
as reported by The Associated Press.
I can't tell you what the statistics are
for folks arrested by the Pampa Police
Department and Gray County Sheriff's
Office but I can tell you it doesn't take
too awfully long to start seeing the same
names ... over and over. There was a guy
last week who got out one day and was
back in the next. Both times the charges
were public intoxication.
But Id digress.
The latest data comes from a study of
prisoners released from 15 states, includ-
ing Texas.
The three-year study followed 272,211
former inmates released from prisons in
I5 states in 1994 . The highest re-arrest
rates were among those who had been

incarcerated for stealing cars ( 79 per-
cent), possession or stealing other stolen property ( 77 percent) and larceny ( 75 percent).
Those with the lowest re-arrest rates were people who had been in prison fo homicide ( 41 percent), sexual assault (4 Strangely, there was no

The findings spark two primary area of debate. There are those who think sen tences aren't long enough and releas equals re-offending. Others think th I fall mo

coddling prisoners. But because most every prisoner we send to jail is comin
out sooner or later, I want him -or her o have the skills to be a productive mem ber of society.

There are those am
There are those among us who are evil ever.

But some can be helped, can be ated, can be taught jobs skills, can be taught coping skills, can be given drug
reatment and so on if we are willing to
utern wo ber for axpayers in the long run.
Id rather have someone like that come back to my community than one of those Super Max guys who are going to get out along for the ride. I think that.

## Preservation drugs could produce new organs for transplant



$\square$ast year, 6,083 patients died awaiting transplants, network officials said recently. Theoretically one-third could have received trans plants had the drugs been universally used, according to a review of 18 months of data comparing donors who were given the drugs and those who were not. Transplant programs will use any organs that are medically
suitable. Those who had received the drugs donated an average of 3.8 organs; for those who didn't, the average was 3.1 . Researchers extrapolated the difference in donation rates for each orgañ to all 5,921 brain-dead donors in 2001, adjusting for found that applying the higher donation rates to the entire group yielded an additional 2,362 organs. livers, 414 lungs and 456 pancreases.
"There's no reason why it couldn't be used theoretically on

Like to cook different types of cuisine, including American and cultural foods? Learn to cut the fat and calo ries whether you are cooking at home or even if you are din

chicken, try broiling, baking or grilling. Big salads make great meals at times, but be careful about how much dressing you add.
Rather than serving a c
broth-based soups with lots of vegetables are meat hamburger minus the cheese and mayo is a better alternative tha chicken fried steak, and choose to prepare baked potato or gravyfree mashed potatoes If you must serve If you must serve
fries, bake them rather than fry them. Sautéed vegetabdes are a tasty choice and much healthier than creamy coleslaw. For dessert, serve non-fat yogurt or sherbet rather than ice
cream and chocolate syrup, or angel foo

Avoid preparing dishes with fried eats, and boil, broil, steam, or lightly stir-fry your meat. Throw in lots of different types of vegetables, including water chestnuts, and leave out the peanuts and cashews. Steamed rice is better for you than fried rice.

Steak is fine, if you can afford it, and if it's a lean, reasonable portion. Don't serve a king-size cut, a six-ounce

Italian Food. Italian food usually means "pasta," and that's good because pasta itself is low in fat. It's the cream
sauce that adds the calories and fat., Bring on the fettuccine sauce that adds the calories and fat. Bring on the fettuccine pizza, use half the cheese, and choose ingredients such as spinach, mushroem, and peppers. Avoid preparing pastas covered with butter or cream sauces or stuffed with cheese. Chinese Food. Use less oil when preparing stir-fry and leave out the soy sauce and salt. Coqk entrees with lots of vegetables such as chop suey with steamed rice. Skip the fried noodles, and instead of preparing egg drop soup, make wonton or hot-and-sour soup.
Steamed dumplings are better for you than egg rolls. Avoid preparing dishes with fried meats, and boil, broil,
