## American fashion icon Blass dies at home in Connecticut

NEW YORK (AP) - Bill Blass, who dressed the likes of Nancy Reagan and Barbara Walters while shattering the Paris-

centric fashion world with youthful creations that mixed-and-matched chic with casual, has Blass died at his home in Washington, Conn., according to Joe Lillis of Lillis Funeral

designer, Helen O'Hagan, said Blass died of cancer. He was 79.
"It's a great loss. He was an extraordinaty man and a great designer," said Fern Mallis, the director of 7th on Sixth, a fashior organization which produces New York's Fashion

ed style.
He received numerous awards He received numerous awards, including

1961, 1963 and 1970, as well as the Council 1961, 1963 and 1970, as well as the Council
of Fashion Designers of America Award in
1986.
Blass won women over with his designs and his charm. He had been listed as one of the best-dressed men in the country. New York fashion guru Nan Kempner once said, "I
fell in love with him, like every woman. He was as warm, friendly, intelligent and talented as he was good-looking."
William Blass was born June 22, 1922, in Fort Wayne, Ind., the only child of Ralph Blass, the owner of a hardware store, and
Ethyl Blass, a dressmaker Blass played foot Ethyl Blass, a dressmaker. Blass played foot-
ball, worked on the school paper and studied arl, worked on the school paper and studied
art at South Side High School in Fort Wayne, where he graduated in 1939 . Blass started sketching designs when he was 17, and sold some to New York designers or $\$ 25$ each.
