## Forest ranger held without bail in fires

DENVER (AP) - A U.S. Forest Service technician
accused of starting the wild accused of starting the wild-
fire that has blackened nearly 103,000 acres and destroyed 22 homes appeared in court in handcuffs Monday and was
ordered held without bail. ordered held without bail. Prosecutors said Terry
Barton, 38 , started the fire Barton, 38 , started the fire
June 8 while burning a letter from her estranged husband, then lied to investigators about it. If convicted of all charges she could be senenced to a total of up to 20 years in pri
