## U.N. nuclear arm to give North Korea one more chance

VIENNA, Austria (AP) - The
U.N. nuclear agency convened an
emergency meeting Monday on the
North Korea crisis, and an official said
the organization would give the com-
munist country a final chance to aban-
don its covert weapons program and
readmit inspectors.
There had been pressure on the
International Atomic Energy Agency
to turn immediately to the U.N.
Security Council for action - possi-
bly including punitive sanctions
against North Korea, which last month
threw out IAEA inspectors and began
reviving adormant nuclear program.
But instead, amid a new diplomatic
push by South Korea for a compro-
mise solution to the crisis, the IAEA
head said Monday that the agency's
board was considering a draft resolu-
tion once again urging North Korea to
comply with its obligations under
global nuclear accords.
In a statement released as the meet-
ing got under way, IAEA Director-
