The services sector overall saw job gains of 73,000 last month, largely led by hiring in health care professions. In that category, temporary employment services added 19,000 watched by analysts because it can help fore cast improvements in other industries Companies typically hire temporary workers when they start growing again. They want to see that improvements are long-lasting before taking on new, full-time help.
