| ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) <br> The Texas Rangers' big bats bailed out R.A. Dickey. <br> The right-hander was on shaky ground after allowing three runs in the first inning, but settled down to pitch a career-high seven innings in the Rangers' 8 - 5 win over the Cleveland Indians on Sunday night. <br> Alex Rodriguez, Rafael Palmeiro and Einar Diaz homered to help Dickey get his first career victory as a starter. <br> Early on, it looked like Dickey's fourth big league start would be a short one. The Indians scored three runs on four hits in the first. But the right-hander bounced back by allowing just one run on three hits over his final six innings. <br> "I'm not a No. 1 starter like Pedro Martinez or Roger Clemens," Dickey said. "I'm just trying to pitch five or six innings and keep the team close." <br> Dickey allowed seven hits and four runs over seven innings. <br> Diaz's fourth homer of the season broke a 4 all tie in the third inning and sent his former team to its fourth straight loss and 13th in 17 games.
