

# Ticket deadline set



# slams into car; 3 die

GRAPEVINE (AP) Three people were killed and three were injured when a sportutility vehicle slammed head-on into a car on a North Texas expressway, officials said.

The accident happened about 9 p.m. Sunday on Texas 360 in Grapevine. Witnesses told police the SUV was driving south in a northbound lane with its lights off when it slammed into an oncoming car.

The Tarrant County medical examiner's office identifies the dead as William Hemel, 27, of Keller, who was at the wheel of the SUV: his daughter. Britany Hemel, 4: and the driver of the car, Amos Brown, 54, of Irving.

# Subdivision still without water

ENCINO, Texas (AP) -Four years after politicians announced plans for a public water system in one South Texas subdivision, not a drop has flowed from broken taps.

More than 100 residents of the small rural community in Brooks County remain without water despite \$2.5 million in grants for a public project in area subdivisions since 1999.

"We just don't feel it's going to happen," resident Cisco Olivarez told the Corpus Christi Caller-Times in Monday's editions. "But we have to get by. We have to do what we can and work with what we have.'

# IRAQ

The night before, two gunmen ambushed a platoon in the Achamivah neighborhood of northern Baghdad, and in the firefight that followed an American was killed, a military statement said.

"Soldiers pursued the attackers and during an ensuing firefight, the soldier was killed. One gunman was killed and the other wounded," the statement said.

Earlier Sunday, a U.S. soldier was shot in the head at close range as he waited to buy a soft drink at Baghdad University.

With ambushes, shootings and bombings taking place daily --- blamed on Saddam loyalists and other disgruntled Iraqis - 30 American soldiers have been killed by hostile action since President Bush declared major combat over on May 1.

Despite increasing attacks against Americans, no extra troops are needed there now, Gen. Tommy Franks, the war's retiring commander, said Monday.

"The sense that I have right now is that it's not time to send in additional troops," he told ABC's "Good Morning America." "We want ... to continue to move forward with establishing security by working with the Iraqis."

In the Iraqi capital, a diverse city council bringing together tribal leaders in headdresses with women in business suits was gaveled into action Monday to advise the U.S.-led administration.

"It's probably the most important day since April 9th, when the coalition came and liberated you from the dictatorship of Saddam Hussein," said L. Paul Bremer, the top U.S. official in Iraq. "Today marks the resumption of the democratic system in Baghdad, which hasn't been here in 30 years."

A democratically elected city council in the southern Shiite Muslim city of Najaf also held its first meeting Monday.

In northern Iraq, U.S. forces on Sunday released 11 Turkish special forces detained last week, the Turkish military said, ending a diplomatic standoff between the two NATO allies.

In Ramadi, 60 miles west of Baghdad, attackers fired a rocket-propelled grenade on a U.S. convoy late Sunday, wounding four American soldiers, the military said. One Iraqi suspect was killed and another wounded.

Tension has increased in the town since a bomb blast Saturday killed seven Iraqi police recruits as they graduated from a U.S.-taught training course. Dozens more were injured.

The U.S. military blamed the attack on pro-Saddam insurgents seeking to target those working with the Americans, but many

Baghdad, was a stronghold of support for Saddam, and has been the site of frequent attacks that have killed Americans as well as Iragis

Both of the American soldiers killed in convoy attacks in Baghdad were from the Army's 1st Armored Division, the Germanybased division charged with occupying the Iraqi capital.

The killing of the U.S. soldier waiting to buy a soft drink Sunday was similar to the slaying of a young British freelance cameraman, who was shot in the head outside a Baghdad museum Saturday.

U.S. Army Maj. William Thurmond said it was too early to tell whether a pattern was emerging that would suggest insurgents are targeting foreign civilians, but he said such a strategy could thwart news gathering and humanitarian relief efforts.

· "Hopefully they're isolated events and we won't have to face them in the future," Thurmond said. "It might work to the advantage of someone who's trying to fight the coalition."

The killing of the television cameraman, 24-year-old Richard Wild, occurred around midday, while the victim was carrying no apparent sign that he was a reporter.

Wild, who arrived in the country two weeks ago, was killed by a single shot fired from close range, colleagues said. The assailant was not apprehended.

In a similar incident June 27, a gunman shot and critically injured a U.S. soldier in the neck as he shopped on a Baghdad street.

The release of the Turkish special forces came after Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan spoke to Vice President Dick Cheney for about 30 minutes by phone Sunday.

The soldiers - and 13 Iraqi staff and security guards who were also held - returned to their office in northern Sulaymaniyah by helicopter Monday, the Turkish military said.

U.S. troops from the 173rd Airborne took the Turkish forces in custody Friday in Sulaymaniyah over an alleged plot to harm Iraqi Kurdish civilian officials in the north. Turkey denied any such plot.

The detentions outraged Turkey, deepened the Turkish public's mistrust of the United States, and strained efforts to repair relations soured over the Iraq war.







# **Russia's Putin refuses** to give in to terrorism

### **By JIM HEINTZ** ASSOCIATED PRESS WRITER

MOSCOW (AP) — In the wake of twin suicide attacks at a Moscow rock festival, President Vladimir Putin vowed Monday that Russia would not give in to terrorism and asserted that Chechen rebels are supported' by international groups.

The separatist rebels that have been fighting Russian forces for nearly four years in Chechnya are seen by officials as being behind the Saturday blasts that killed 15 people, including the two female bombers, and injured scores.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack, but news reports have said a passport was found at the site showing that one of the bombers was a Chechen.

Putin, in a meeting with his Cabinet, said "today, after the latest series of terrorist acts, we can say that the bandits active in Chechnya are not simply con-I nected with international terrorist organizations, they have become an integral, maybe the most dangerous part, of the international web."

"No country in the world bows to the dictates of terrorists and Russia will not do so either," Putin said, according to the news agency Interfax. "We must pluck them out from the basements and caves where. they are hiding and destroy them."

The statement echoed the harsh language that Putin used as prime minister in 1999, shortly before Russian forces swept back into Chechnya at the start of the second war in the republic in a decade.

into a bloody stalemate in which Russian forces pound rebel positions with artillery and air strikes while the rebels kill Russians in near-daily hit-andrun attacks.

The Kremlin has refused to negotiate with Chechnya's rebel president Aslan Maskhadov, and prominent human rights activist Lev Ponomaryov said Monday that policy only encourages "ultraradicals."

"Save the lives of tens and hundreds of future victims of 'living bothbs' - demand the start of peaceful negotiations with Maskhadov," Ponomaryov, head of the For Human Rights group, said in a statement directed at Russian politicians.

The bombing of the rock festival was a grim reminder of how the sprawling Russian capital is vulnerable to terrorism. The bombing brought back painful memories of last October's raid on a Moscow theater by scores of Chechen rebels; 129 hostages died, almost all from effects of the narcotic gas that special forces pumped in to end the siege.

Moscow mayor Yuri Luzhkov declared Tuesday a day of mourning in the city, meaning that entertainment programs will not be shown on local television and comedies will not be performed in the city's theaters.

He also announced that relatives of those killed would receive \$3,300 in compensation and victims who needed hospitalization would get \$1,650. City health officials said 38

No party gained a majority in Sunday's midterm congressional elections. Voters, frustrated with Fox's inability to deliver on promises of reform, economic growth and a migration accord with the United States, set the stage for three more years of inaction.


