New Hampshire man pleads innocent to murder charges while officials continue search for children

MANCHESTER, N.H. (AP) - A New
Hampshire man pleaded innocent to charges he killed his man pleaded innocent o charges he killed his son and daughter while law enforce-
ment officials widened the search for the children s bodies.
Manuel Gehring, 44, of Concord, pleaded innocent Thursday in Hillsborough County Superior Court to two counts of first-degree
The children, Sarah, 14, and Philip, 11 , were last seen arguing with Gehring at a July 4
fireworks display in Concord. Police believe he killed them after leaving Concord and buried them the next day in the Midwest. Northwest Ohio - a rural area up to 10
miles on either side of Interstate 80 near the Indiana state line and around the Toledo Express Airport - had been the focus of the search for the bodies.
The FBI announced Thursday that it had expanded that search to all of Ohio and into Pennsylvania based on based on new, unspecified information.
