Nathaniel Heatwole, 20 Damascus, Md, was charged Monday in federal court in Baltimore with ak ing a dangerous weapon aboard an aircraft. The case followed discovery of bags containing box cutters, bleach and other prohibited ems aboard two Southwest Airlines planes.
Heatwole sent an e-mail federal authorities in midSeptember saying he had put the items aboard two specific Southwest flights as an act of civil disobedience o expose weaknesses in the security system, an FBI affi davit said. The objects were not found until last week more than a month later.
The TSA did not send the
e-mail to the FBI until las Friday. FBI agents then viewed him.
After his court appearAne Monday, Heatwole, a Greensboro N.C released without bail for a preliminary hearing Nov 10. He faces up to 10 years in prison.
Rep. Peter DeFazio, the op Democrat on the House Transportation aviation subcommittee, said someone should be fired because of the incident. But he said Ley, a former Coast Guard commandant, should stay if he owns up to what the agency's deficiencies are.

Fatalism is the tribute that those apart from God pay to the notion that spiritual forces exist, so in one way it's a step up from atheism, but it is also the last refuge of those who refuse to examine closely the specific detail of failure.
God generally works through people, and people in tough circumstances need to get their emotions under control. Red Sox outfielder Trot Nixon wonderfully described the prayer he offered before heading to the plate and hitting a key home run in the Boston-Oakland series: " asked for the Lord to quiet my nerves." judgment and baseball is above all judgment, and baseball is above all a
game of non-sentimental, non-nervous game of non-sentimental, non-nervous
judgment: for hitters, when to swing, and for managers, when to make changes. Cubs fans have their own stories tell, but the two major disasters in recent

The ball never would have gone through Red Sox first baseman Bill Buckner's legs in 1986 if the Red Sox manager had followed his usual procedure and given Buckner's creaking knees a rest by putting in a defensive replacement. The Red Sox probably would have beaten the Yankees in this year's seventh game if the current Red Sox manager had followed his usual procedure and used what had become a prize bullpen instead of leaving in Pedro Martinez.
