## Another government surprise

Just when you think there is nothing

faxed release submitted to The News, that the blimp "will do nothing to solve the. maze of confusion surrounding the Medicare program.

During the war, the 13 colonies formed a union under the Articles of Confederation (1778) whereby "Each state retains its sovereignty, freedom, and independence, and every power, jurisdiction, and right, which is not by this Confederation expressly delegated to the United States, in Congress assembled." The Treaty of Paris (1783) that ended the war between the colonies and Great Britain recognized 13 sovereign nations.
