tion medication known as morning-atter pills. Their rejection represents a missed opportunity to reduce unwanted pregnan-
cies and abortions. Worse still. the officials contrived a ludicrous argument on which to base their decision,

drug, Plan B. to avoid pregnancy without a doctor's supervi-

Barr now will have to come up with a way to prevent juve-
niles under 16 from buying it or conduct new studies to show
that they can use it safely on their own.

Gandhi-led opposition wins coup
NEW DELHI (AP) -
India's opposition Congress India's opposition Congress
party captured the most seats in parliamentary elections, according to early results Thursday, a stunning defeat for
Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee that was almost certain to return the Gandhi dynasty to power.
Vajpayee's ruling party conceded defeat, opening the way for Sonia Gandhi, the Italianborn widow of the former Prime Minister Rajii Gandhi, to become the country's leader. It was one of the most dramatic political upsers since Indian
independence almost 60 years ago. The results reflected the feeling by millions of India's rural poor that they had been left out of the economic boom promoted by Vajpayee's Bharatiya Janata Party-led government.
"We have not got the man-
date of the people," said BJP date of the people," said BJP President Venkaiah Naidu, adding that the decision was
taken at 90 -minute meeting of taken at a 90 -minute meeting of the party and its coalition part-
ners. Congress and its allies had
already claimed victory and already claimed victory and
declared that Gandhi, the party leader, would be the next prime minister, after early results showed the party and its allies were ahead of Vajpayee's 11 member National Democratic Alliance.
After more than foutr hours of vote-counting for 539 of Parliament's 543 elected seats. all television stations cited unofficial figures showing
Gandhi's bloc ahead of the Gandhi's bloc ahe

It was an embarrassing defeat for Vajpayee's Hindu
nationalist-led government. nationalist-led government,
which had called elections six months early because it felt confident of winning an even bigger majority in Parliament, based on the roaring economy and prospects of peace with Pakistan.
Before the five-phased elections, which began April 20. Vajpayee and his alliance had been expected to win enough seats to eventually form a govfor another five years
for another five years.
But Congress focused its campaign on the country $\$ 300$ less than a dollar a day. It hammered away at the lack of even basic infrattructure, electricity and potable water for millions of rural poor.
A leader in Vajpayee's coalition said the results were "totally against our expectations. Gandhi has pushed for a secular India in contrast to the BJP's Hindu nationalist message. Her two children, Rahul and Priyanka, are up-and-coming politicians and state-run television reported that Rahul won his race to enter ment for the first time. The Gandhi dynasty dominated Indian politics since inde-
pendence from British colonial pendence from British colonial
rule in 1947. Jawaharlal Nehru, India's first prime minister. headed the country from independence until his 1964 death. He was followed by his daughter, Indira Gandhi, who was killed by her own bodyguards in 1984.
