## Archivists to preserve assassination recording

| Archivists are trying to preserve and copy what they say is the only sound recording from the moment of John F. Kennedy's assassination, captured by a Dallas police motorcycle radio. <br> The recording came from a police radio stuck in the "on" position, which relayed sounds of the Nov. 22, 1963. assassination to headquarters where they were etched onto dictation belts. But the recording is too fragile to be played again and has never been authentically copied. <br> For years researchers have studied inferior copies. Some <br> motorcade, concluding that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone. But others say it shows four shots were fired and conclude Oswald was aided by a second gunman. <br> "There is not closure on this issue," Gary Mack, curator of the Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza, told The Dallas Morning News in Monday's online edition. Al-Qaida computer seized in arrest reveals plans to target U.S. and Britain

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan

suspect wanted for the 1998 twin U.S. embassy bombings in East Africa, the information minister said.
The plans were found in emails on the computer of Ahmed Khalfan Ghailani, a
Tanzanian arrested July 25 after a 12 -hour gunbattle in the eastern city of Gujrat. Information Minister Sheikh Rashid Ahmed told The Associated
Monday.

Ahmed would not confirm whether the information prompted U.S. Homeland Security Secretary Tom Ridge to issue a warning Sunday about a possible alQaida attack on financial
institutions in New York, institutions in New York,
Washington and Newark, N.J. However, Ridge specifically thanked Pakistan for its help in the war on terror during his press conference. from Ghailani's computer from (plans for) attacks in
