cap and whose story inspired John Wayne to portray his life on screen, has died. Adair, 89, died Saturday of natural causes at a Houston hospital, his daughter, Robyn Adair, told The Associated Pruss early
Sunday.
He is credited with battling more than He is credited with oatting more than
2,000 land and offshore oil well fires. His death-defying feats included battling the July 1988 explosion of the Piper Alpha platform
that killed 167 men in the stormy North Sea, that killed 167 men in the stormy North Sea,
120 miles off the coast of Scotland. Former President George H.W. Bush called
Adair a true hero.
