are bringing in at least $\$ 262$ million more annually after the Texas
Legislature allowed them Legislature allowed them to set their own tuition, a newspaper

published in Mondays editions. The analysis shows the remainder is split between financial aid for students and various costs to run a university. such as lah equipment.
