## Lord's Acre got its start from charitable action of one man

Folks called it the Lord's Acre. In addition to whatever they
might put in the collection plate might put in the collection plate give the proceeds from one acre of their crop land to their church each year. Though not as common as it
used to be, the tradition has used to be, the tradition has
endured in some corners of Texas particularly Taylor County.
But like most customs, it has evolved over the years. Farmers no longer earmark the bounty of an acre of their land to give away, but
once a year the farmers, ranchers once a year the farmers, rancher
and local merchants in the souther part of Taylor County donate food crafts and other items to be sold at auction to benefit their church and its benevolent fund. In 11-mile wide, 17-mile deep Mulberry Canyon, about 20 mile concept can be traced to a charitable act on the part of one man in the late 19th century
 ranch covered much of the canyon,
in 1894 donated some of his land for a school. That marked the beginning of Taylor County's known District No. 28, better known as the Butman School.
Butman and other ranchers and Butman and other ranchers and
farmers in the area ponied up farmers in the area ponied up
enough money to build a oneroom, 20 by 30 foot school house on the land the rancher had conveyed for public use. Then they hired a teach
By 1918, the school had enough students to justify a larger building, which the trustees paid for with the issuance of $\$ 1,250$ in bonds. A year later, the school qualified for state support for the first time. In 1928, the community built a
wooden, open-air tabernacle on the wooden, open-air tabernacle on the property. It became a gathering
place for social events, political
stump\%o speeches and musical
and dramatic performances. The Butnam family also threw a rodeo year until World War II.

Eventually the Butman Schoo and 15 other small districts in Taylor County got folded into the Merkel Independent Schoo District. Butman bought the land back from the Merkel ISD, but the family later deeded it to the Pioneer Memorial United
Methodist Church, which opened in early 1951. Two years

On Nov. 27, 1978, San Francisco Mayor George Moscone and City Supervisor Harvey Milk, a gay-rights activist, were
shot to death inside City Hall by former supervisor Dan White.

## Iraq study group meets; Congress showing increased impatience

## By BEN FELLER Associated Press Writer

 WASHINGTON (AP) Bush administration is stepping up diplomatic efforts to stabilize Iraq,even as key congressional figures say their confidence in Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki's government is waning.
As members of the Iraq Study Group prepared to sit down today to talk over their soon-to-be-
released recommendations for changes in U.S. war strategy, President Bush left for a NATO summit in Europe and a meeting afterward with al-Maliki in Amman, Jordan.
Sectarian violence in Iraq is at its worst level in the roughly $31 / 2$
years since a U.S.-led coalition invaded the country and toppled Saddam Hussein. Bush's summit this week comes in the wake of lalks that Vice President Dick cheney held over the weekend in special study commission mull recmenendations. The New York Times reported in
Monday's editions that a draft Monday's editions that a draft
report by the study panel led by
former Secretary of State James A.
Baker III recommends aggressive regional diplomacy, including talks with Iran and Syria.

Anonymous officials who had seen the draft report told the Times it does not specify any timetables
for the withdrawal of U.S. troops from Iraq, although the commissioners are expected to debate the feasibility of such timetables. Appearing today on ABC's
"Good Morning America" former "Good Morning America," former President Jimmy Carter said that ing" for the report. "My guess is that President Bush will take their advice as much as he possibly can," he added.
Carter said he would agree with any call for direct U.S. talks with Iran and Syria over Iraq, adding: "This is one of the most counterproductive policies that I've ever
known, ... not to talk to who disagree with you unless they who disagree with you unless they
agree in advance to everything you agree in advance to everything you
demand." demand.
