pushed total spending for the month to a seapushed total spending for the month to a sea-

Commerce Department reported Thursday. The December gain followed a much
smaller 0.1 percent rise in November and reflected the fact that consumers wer spending heavily on new cars in response to
the return of attractive incentive programs. the return of attractive incentive programs. percent last month after having fallen by 1 percent in November
Excluding autos, consumer spending rose by a more moderate 0.3 percent in
December, slightly lower than the 0.4 percent increase excluding autos in November

budget cycle. However, the plan would only generate about $\$ 1.6$
billion per year in state funds after accounti
tax reduction.
$\qquad$ Dewhurst said the plan would close loopall businesses except sole proprietors to
pay.
The franchise tax, which five of every six Texas businesses currently avoid paying,
would be reduced by more than half. Other money for schools would be generated from a combination of a higher sales tax, motor vehicle tax, cigarette tax and alcohol tax, though details still need to be worked out, the senators said. The proposal, which still must make its way through the Legislature, replaces the cant property tax relief, focuses dollars into current property tax
