## **Officials stress safety during July Fourth holiday**

#### **By MARILYN POWERS** Staff Writer

The Fourth of July is Tuesday, and government and law enforcement officials are offering safety tips to make it as enjoyable as possible for area residents.

July 4 is the second most deadly holiday of the year for motorists, right behind New Year's, said Trooper Daniel Hawthorne, public information officer for the Texas Department of Public Safety office in Childress.

At least 253 people were killed in alcohol-related vehicle accidents

across America during the Fourth of to spend the holiday at an area lake. July holiday period in 2004. Of those, 225 involved a driver, motorcycle operator or non-occupant with a blood alcohol concentration level of .08 or higher.

"Remember to plan not to drive ahead of time," Hawthorne said. "If you wait until you've started drinking, you will make the wrong decision.

"Don't take a vehicle to parties if you're going to drink. Don't drink at all if you are driving. Buzz driving is still drunken driving," he said.

Some residents may be planning

Lake McClellan, south of Pampa, is still closed and will not be open for at least a couple of months, according to Tom Smeltzer, natural resource specialist with the U.S. Forest Service's Cheyenne, Okla., office. The office manages the Black Kettle and McClellan Creek National Grasslands, which includes Lake McClellan as well as Lake Marvin near Canadian.

Lake McClellan was closed after wildfires earlier this year damaged a number of trees and other structures at the lake, resulting in hazardous

conditions for visitors.

The burned trees at Lake McClellan pose a hazard to the public because they are more likely to drop damaged limbs or to fall over, Smeltzer said.

"About 300 will have to come out," he said. "We're working on getting a contractor for that."

Anything which could potentially fall and hit where people are allowed to camp and picnic must be removed before the lake will reopen, he said. Lake Marvin, east of Canadian at

### Less money in next year's city budget

The City of Pampa expects income this year of about \$17,018,000.

As Robin Bailey, the city's finance director, worked on the figures for next year's preliminary budget, she said there is less money in next year's budget than last because of bond issue funds that were available last year.

Last year, the city's budget projected an income of \$19,626,000. But much of that was because of grants like the one that bought a new fire truck and because of bond revenue that was available.

of town. There was a Welcome to Pampa sign there until about a year ago when a truck failed to negotiate the curve and took out the sign and much of the

landscaping around it. Sutherland, a Pampa businessman and former city commissioner, became the point man for rebuilding the welcoming sign.

"I'm in the Rotary Club and the Rotary Club had adopted Sunset Park several years ago," Sutherland said.

Quanah both have nice welcome signs to their communities

"I've seen several that I really do like," Sutherland said.

Appearing before the commission Tuesday night, Sutherland presented them with some of the ideas his Rotary committee had discussed along with sketches of what a sign might look like.

"The general fund is down almost \$200,000 because of the grant we got for our fire 'truck," Bailey said.

She said that on the revenue side of the equation, however, revenue streams such as the hotel/motel tax, sales tax and ad valorum taxes should be up.

The hotel/motel tax is expected to be about \$50,000 over last year.

Pampa City Manager John Horst said the city has already collected as much in hotel/motel taxes in the first six months of this year as it did for the entire year last year.

He said the taxes from the new motel that opened earlier this year have not vet begun to flow into city coffers and another motel is expected to open soon.

Sales taxes are projected to be \$2.8 million this next budget year. Last year, sales tax revenues were \$2.75 million.

The city had received \$2,380,722 in sales tax revenue as of June.

That's \$349,028 more than for the same period last year, Bailey said.

Ad valorum taxes will be higher than last year, Bailey said, but that's because



Cheney's high-tech pacemaker doing job

WASHINGTON (AP) Vice President Dick Cheney's pacemaker is working properly and his overall heart condition is stable, according to results from his annual physical Saturday.

The 65-year-old Cheney, who has a long history of heart ailments, had an electrocardiogram and hightech imaging to check on repaired aneurysms on the attacks; the first in 1978, back of his knees, his spokeswoman said.

Doctors also checked the condition of a high-tech pacemaker, known as an implantable cardioverter defibrillator, that was placed in his chest in June

"The stent grafs used to treat the popliteal artery aneurysms are wide open," McBride said.

WASHINGTON (AP) A Christian-themed movie after hearing complaints about a football coach's faith in God is finding an audience in Congress — not so much for its inspirational message, but for the PG rating it received.

House Majority Whip Roy Blunt, R-Mo., and lawmakers other are

demanding explanations It says religion was not the reason for the rating.

"This incident raises the disquieting possibility that the MPAA considers exposure to Christian themes more dangerous for children than exposure to gratuitous sex and violence," Blunt said in a letter to MPAA Chairman and Chief Executive Officer Dan Glickman.

After meeting with MPAA officials, Blunt and a handful of other House members said they remain concerned about the subjective native of the ratings process.

"I'm not satisfied," said Rep. Marsha Blackburn, R-Tenn., who attended the meeting with Blunt. "We probably will want to revisit this ratings process to have some commonality in the standards that exist for movies, videos and video games.'

Blackburn said she wants the House Energy and Commerce Committee to hold hearings on the issue later this year.

Blunt also brought up a recent study by the Harvard School of Public Health that found that the MPAA standards on sex and violence in movies have been getting weaker.

"Mr. Blunt does continue to have questions about the process by which 'Facing the Giants' was rated and what that says about ratings creep in general," spokeswoman Burson Taylor said Friday.

"What people need to know is that some fireworks such as Roman candles are very unpredictable," Kotara said.

The Texas Forest Service advises that anyone wishing to use fireworks should practice good fireworks safety, because of continued dry conditions, according to a press release from the service.

"Texas Forest Service advises that fireworks should only be used with close adult supervision and that fireworks use should be restricted to safe areas, away from grass and brush. Tools that should be kept nearby or close are a water hose, bucket or buckets of water and wet towels. Fireworks must also be kept away from homes and other structures with untreated wood roofs, which might be ignited by fireworks," according to the release.

"They need to think about safety and where they're at and the environment around them, and not shoot some things if there's any wind," Kotara said.

"If everybody has good common sense, they'll have a safe holiday," he said.

Sutherland described the sign as possibly being brick with rock corners or highlights. The face of the sign would be stucco with dark lettering, flat, not raised, against the surface.

It would read "Welcome to Pampa," he said, and beneath that if there is room would be Est. 1902. Sutherland said if the commission wanted, there could be a city or county seal on the sign.

Although of one Sutherland's sketches showed the pine trees that were planted there long ago, he said that at least one, if not two, of the trees were dead.

"We want to completely redo the thing," Sutherland said. "Hopefully, we could sell or trade the trees that are there. I don't know whether they're salvageable."

He noted that the pine trees are not native to the area. Sutherland said his committee was suggesting replacing the pines with red oaks.

Sutherland said he would like to see buffalo grass around the sign and any trees. It's sturdy and native to the area. Therefore, he said, it would be appropriate.

He said his committee opposed small bushes or shrubs that would need attention and could impair the visibility of the sign. Nor, he said, did he want to see flowers planted there that would require a lot of labor.

"There's water and electricity at the site," Sutherland said. "So there's no problem as far as lights or a sprinkler system."

Sutherland suggested a small guardrail to protect it from being overrun by runaway vehicles again.

"It would need to be a

nice one," he said.

Sutherland said that the adjoining land on the triangular block could be purchased from its current owner.

"That little lot is not but about 75 feet long and 45 feet wide," Sutherland said.

"It's the main entrance to the city," Sutherland said. "Probably more folks go by that entrance than any other entrance in our city. There's a good many folks that would like to see something happen there."

The total cost of the project sketched out by Sutherland would be about \$25,000 if no labor or materials were donated.


"There's \$6,000 worth of insurance money from the truck that ran through the sign," Sutherland said.

There's been some discus-

sion about the city putting in money in addition to the \$6,000, he said. There have also been discussions about getting grants or funding from other sources such as Xcel Energy or Burlington Northern-Santa Fe Railroad or the Pampa Economic Development Corp., he said. A Texas Department of Transportation grant had been explored, but is not an option at the moment.

Sutherland said some people have suggested putting a pump jack or caboose on the lot, but that would drive up the cost and the adjoining lot would need to be purchased for such a move.

Sutherland said that this is a city park. It is a piece of city property and anything that's done to it must be approved by the city commission.

appraisals are up. Gray County Judge Richard Peet told Horst tolook for a slight increase in ad valorum collection expenses.

"They have not gone up in since the county started collecting for us," Horst said. "They've done an excellent job on holding the line on those costs.'

Unfortunately, Horst said, costs are also going up. The fuel that runs the city vehicles is obviously up, but Horst said any materials the city purchases from the petro-chemical industry from fertilizer to seal coating is up.

Bailey said, "we're up 130 "Water treatment costs active water connections have gone up four percent, over last year."

There are 7,470 wastewater connections now versus 7,381 this time last year, she said.

"That's up 89," Bailey said.

The preliminary figures for the budgetary process went to the commission Tuesday night. Horst said the staff is still gathering figures so it doesn't have everything yet.



And have you also noticed that usually there is also a team or two that loses almost every game? Question: Why do you think that happens?

From 1970-2000 I had the privilege of volunteering to coach girls and boys in basketball, football, baseball and volleyball in five different states. Some of those seasons were spent with little kids (under 12) and some were with teenagers. With that 30 years as background, let's answer the question: Why do you think that happens?

Some folks suggest that it is better coaching and better coaching can surely have some impact, but it can't account for undefeated records season after season.

Do you want to know why children's sports programs all over the country end up with teams who never taste defeat and teams who never win? The adults overseeing the program do a lousy job of equally dividing the children. Some teams are "stacked," while others get the "short end of the stick." In fact, in most children's sports leagues, equality of competition isn't even a major goal.

You see, the "perfect season" in a children's sports league should be where every team wins half of their games and loses half of their games. That way every kid could learn how to: 1, win with grace, 2, lose with manners and 3, experience the genuine improvement that only comes from fair and equal competition.



### Coffee may reduce risk of cirrhosis

CHICAGO (AP) — Coffee may counteract alcohol's poisonous effects on the liver and help prevent cirrhosis, researchers say.


In a study of more than 125,000 people, one cup of coffee per day cut the risk of alcoholic cirrhosis by 20 percent. Four cups per day reduced the risk by 80 percent. The coffee effect held true for women and men of various ethnic backgrounds.

It is unclear whether it is the caffeine or some other ingredient in coffee that provides the protection, said study co-author Dr. Arthur Klatsky of the Kaiser Permanente Division of Research in Oakland, Calif.

Of course, there is a better way to avoid alcoholic cirrhosis of the liver, Klatsky said.

"The way to avoid getting ill is not to drink a lot of coffee, but to cut down on the drinking" of alcohol, he said.

The participants ranged from teetotalers, who made up 12 percent of the total, to heavy drinkers, who made up 8 percent.

## **Rangers 3, Astros 1**

(AP) — Mark Teixeira finally got a hit to fall, with no questions about whether it was fair or foul.

Teixeira ended an 0-for-17 slump with a leadoff double in the seventh inning, then scored the goahead run for the Texas Rangers in their 3-1 victory over the Houston Astros on Friday night that snapped a season-worst five-game losing streak.

"It felt great to break out of it and get a win," said Teixeira, hitless the previous four games.

The only time Teixeira went five straight games without a hit was in April 2003, in his first five games in the major leagues.

Teixeira thought he had a bases-clearing double in the ninth inning Tuesday night in San Francisco, but it was ruled foul even though the ball appeared to land on the line and kick up chalk. After Teixeira argued and was ejected, his pinch hitter flied out and the Rangers lost.

Against the Astros and Roy Oswalt (6-4), Teixeira hit a flare that dropped between center fielder. Willy Taveras and second baseman Chris Burke, who collided and were shaken up on the play. Neither left the game.

### Astros manager granted review of suspension

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — Houston Astros manager Phil Garner didn't miss Friday night's game at Texas after asking for a review of his one-game suspension.

Garner was suspended. after tossing a chair onto the field following his ejection during a loss in Detroit on Monday. He was supposed to serve the suspension during the opener of the three-game series against the Rangers.

### F1 tries to win forgiveness

(AP) — It was one of the lowest moments in recent Formula One history, when 14 cars ducked off the track at Indianapolis Motor Speedway in a boycott of last year's United States Grand Prix.

The drivers were concerned about the safety of their Michelin tires, which had several failures during race preparations. When no solution was offered and no compromise could be agreed upon, they refused to race.

"The problem was just too much of a safety issue," driver Giancarlo Fisichella said. "The best thing to do was just go home."

But when they walked out the back gate at Indy, they might have permanently tarnished F1 in America. As, E1 returns to the

USGP in Indy this weekend, the series' future is at a serious crossroads in the only country that has yet to embrace it.

### Cuban, Mays hope to avoid Nash scenario with Terry

DALLAS (AP) - Jason Terry has been saying for weeks that his goal in free agency is to stay in Dallas. Thing is, wary Mavericks fans remember Steve Nash saying the same things two years ago - until he signed with Phoenix.

Mavs owner Mark Cuban vows things will be different this time.

Cuban plans to make Terry an offer as soon as free agency begins at 12:01 a.m. EDT Saturday. A quick resolution would enable club officials to get on with the next phase of their offseason plans: signing Dirk Nowitzki and Josh Howard to contract extensions.

"Our priority is our own free agents," Cuban said. "I'm pretty sure we should be able to (keep them). We haven't been able to get into the details yet, but they've given us pretty much every indication that they want to stay, so that's good to know."

If all three pieces fall into place, Dallas likely would have the top three players from its Western Conference championship squad locked up through 2010-11 season. the Howard is 26, Nowitzki turned 28 last week and 29 Terry turns in September.

Keith Van Horn, Adrian Griffin, D.J. Mbenga and

Darrell Armstrong are Dallas' other free agents. Armstrong is the most likely of them to return.

The Mavs might also look around for a backup to Nowitzki and a veteran point guard. While deals can be reached now, nothing can be signed before July 12.

Dallas is over the salary cap, but still has the midlevel exception. Beyond a payday, the Mavericks can offer players a spot on a team coming off a finals appearance and Cuban's reputation for taking care of players.

Terry would be among the top free agents on the market this summer if not for his oft-state desire to remain with the Mavericks. He's still likely to get a high-dollar offer, perhaps in the range of \$40 million over five years.

When Nash went into free agency, Cuban didn't make an offer, instead hoping to match the best one Nash could get. Then the Suns offered more years and a lot more money than Cuban ever expected and he let Nash walk. The fact he's been MVP each of his two seasons in Phoenix hurts the Mays less now that they're coming off their first appearance in the NBA finals.

The race to make the title hunt begins at Daytona International Speedway with Saturday night's Pepsi 400, the first in a frantic 10-race push that will determine who will be a player on NASCAR's biggest

stage. With only 89 points separating sixth through 10th place, and a handful of drivers within striking distance of a coveted playoff position, anything can happen during this upcoming stretch through the dog days of summer.

"It's tough, and I've felt the pressure now for weeks," said Greg Biffle, who currently sits in ninth - a race win out of fifth, but also 31 points out of 11th.

But there's nothing I can do about it. I'm just going to concentrate and try to get a top-five finish every week and try to win races

Jeff Gordon used that philosophy last week on the road course in California. He went into the race 11th in the standings, won the race and catapulted to eighth. That kind of movement should be expected from now until the Chase field is set following the Sept. 9 race in Richmond, Va.

The first shakeup could come on Saturday night at Daytona, an unpredictable restrictor-plate race that could wreak havoc on the standings. Nothing is a given here and a driver can go from first to 30th in the span of a single lap. No one is immune from the multi-car crashes that can wipe out half the field, or the split-second wrong decision that can shuffle a driver to the back of the field.

Not even points leader Jimmie Johnson, winner of the Daytona 500 and the plate race at Talladega, thinks he is immune.

"There are just too many variables in our sport," he said. "I feel like I'm in a great position. But if you hit three or four races where you're crashed out early - and we all know about plate racing - you can find yourself in trouble in a hurry."

Boris Said won the pole in Friday qualifying, running a lap at 186.143 mph to claim the top starting spot for the first time since 2003. Said, a road-racing specialist, won the only other pole of his career at Infineon Raceway in Sonoma, Calif.

Defending race champion Tony Stewart will start second, and will be followed by rookie David Stremme, Jeff Gordon, Joe Nemechek, rookie Denny Hamlin, Dale Jarrett, rookie Martin Truex Jr., Johnson and Matt Kenseth.

Stewart will be looking to regain some momentum with a strong run on Saturday night. He led all but nine laps en route to a dominating victory last season.

Stewart, the two-time Cup champion, has been sliding backward in the standings since breaking his shoulder blade in an accident five weeks ago. He's finished 42nd, 25th, third, 41st and 28th the past five weeks, and dropped from fourth to seventh in the standings.

A lock to make the Chase a month ago, Stewart is only 67 points away from being bounced out of the top 10.

"We're cautiously optimistic that we're going to run well," he said. "We need a good week. The good thing is that the morale of the team is up. This team has battled adversity so many times that it takes a lot to beat this team down."

Many drivers sitting outside the top 10 will look to Kenseth's frantic race into the Chase last year as a model for making it. After a miserable start to the season, Kenseth vaulted from 20th to 11th in the standings in the span of about a month last August and continued the push to claim the ninth spot in the Chase.

Kurt Busch, who currently sits in 14th in the standings, has familiarized himself with Kenseth's 2005 march and is using it to remain calm about his current predicament. Winner of the first Chase, Busch is currently 165 points out of the top 10.

"There is no pressure to do things quick," Busch said. "I think Kenseth, even after the second Pocono (20th race) was still struggling, and he put it together. I don't know if that is the cutoff where you start to feel nervous if you are in or you are out.

"But we feel like we have a bunch of good guys in front of us, a bunch of good guys behind us, so why don't we just go do our jobs and not worry about it??

The contract with the Speedway expires after this event, and no one is 100 percent sure it will be back.

Speedway president Joie Chitwood said that, assuming Sunday's event is problem-free, Indy wants to bring back the race it began hosting in 2000.

"We absolutely would want to continue the relationship," Chitwood said. "We've made a huge investment in our facility to host the race, and it was for a seven-year event. We think it can be successful in America, and Indy is the place it should be.'

But when asked if F1 organizers wanted to remain in Indy - or America for that matter - Chitwood had no answer.

"I've learned that it's not safe to try to figure out what Formula One thinks," he said. "But I would hope they would feel the same way we do."

Even that is up for debate, especially after F1 boss Bernie Ecclestone made puzzling comments in several interviews last week. Ecclestone downplayed the importance of having a presence in the U.S., and said he wouldn't back down off the enormous fee (estimated to be \$20 million) he charges promoters to host a Grand Prix.

"What do we get from America? Aggravation, that's about all," he said. "It does not matter to Formula One if there is no grand prix in the U.S.



## **Amarillo site of upcoming** storm shelter meeting

LUBBOCK — The National Storm funding exists to support the installation Shelter Association, housed on the campus of Texas Tech University in Lubbock, will conduct a workshop starting at 9:30 a.m. July 7 to discuss construction standards the association has established for safe rooms/tornado shelters and to talk about NSSA membership.

The meeting will be held at the TA&MU Research & Extension Center in Amarillo and is primarily intended for building contractors who work in the Texas Panhandle.

The Texas Panhandle is the inaugural site of a program new to the State of Texas - the Safe Room Rebate Program.

The City of Amarillo and the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission have each received funding from FEMA through the Governor's Division of Emergency Management to implement separate, simultaneous programs.

Amarillo's program is intended to serve residents of that city, while the PRPC's program will focus on residents within the 26-county area of the Panhandle outside Amarillo. Between the two programs,

of at least 900 safe rooms/tornado shelters in the region.

As the administrator for the program, GDEM has determined that all safe rooms/shelters installed under this program must have a NSSA seal affixed to the shelter. Currently, there are only a handful of contractors in the area who have been qualified by NSSA to affix the seal.

Increasing the number of NSSA companies available in the Panhandle will be important to the success of the program.

The Safe Room Rebate Program may provide eligible residents with a cash rebate to cover half the cost of installing a NSSA-certified safe room/shelter in their home up to a maximum amount of \$2,500.

## West Texas A&M university to manage 12,000 acres for **Bureau of Land Management**

CANYON — Faculty and students of wildlife biology West Texas A&M at University are going to be authorized caretakers for almost 12;000 acres of land in Potter County.

Officials from West Texas A&M and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will sign an agreement at 11 a.m. Thursday, July 6 that will formalize the University's long-term commitment to manage what is known as the Cross Bar Cooperative Management Area, an 11,833.8-acre tract about 10 miles north of Amarillo.

The document will be presented and signed in the Agriculture and Science Building, Room 103, on campus. Signatories will be University President J. Patrick O'Brien and Linda S.C. Rundell, BLM state director for New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas and Kansas.

A mutually beneficial informal agreement has been in place for several years between WTAMU and the BLM. The Cross Bar has served as an outdoor classroom for University students, who in turn have provided expertise and manpower to help accomplish property

management objectives for

which the BLM does not lead in managing the Cross have the necessary resources.

"This type of agreement gives our students the chance to get practical experience working with plants and animals in their natural habitat, and at the same time it gives us the opportunity to perform a public service," Dr. Brian R. Chapman, provost/vice president for academic affairs, said. "The Cross Bar ecosystem is a valuable public asset, and it's in everyone's best interest to maintain it properly.

"We are delighted to be entrusted with this important mission.'

Dr. Ray Matlack and Dr. Richard Kazmaier, assistant professors of biology, and their students have taken the

Bar - taking down fences, installing wildlife waterers, planting trees, re-seeding closed roads and picking up trash. They are performing research on the effects of fire on natural grasslands, and they are inventorying plant and animal species presently on the property.

"It's a great hands-on opportunity," Chapman said. "We're doing a study on the Texas horned lizard, which is on the Texas Endangered List, and at the same time we're removing non-native vegetation such as salt cedar, which drains water from the soil very rapidly. It's science. It's land management. It's very exciting because it's what a university should be doing.'

## National Cowboy Museum opens American Indian art exhibition

OKLAHOMA CITY — As Oklahoma prepares for its Centennial, a new National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum exhibit in Oklahoma City celebrates a century of American Indian art that began during the 1870s and concluded 30 years ago.

"The First 100 Years: Southern Plains Painting and Drawing" considers the graphic art tradition of Oklahoma's first residents. On display through Oct. 8, the exhibit has been designated an official Oklahoma Centennial event.

Most of the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum's collection of American Indian painting was acquired from Oklahoma City collector Arthur Silberman. In 1978, Silberman organized an exhibit at the Oklahoma Museum of Art that was called 100 Years of Native American Painting. In the catalog that accompanied the display, he summarized the American Indian painting tradition in this way:

"Until approximately one hundred years ago, Native American painting was a form of religious expression and a kind of shorthand used mainly to

record personal and tribal histories ... Painting was part of a lifestyle in which art, refined by a keen sense of aesthetics, permeated every aspect of Indian life from birth to death. Then, under the pressures and stresses of their disintegrating world, Indian artists transformed painting into an expressive and vital art form. Individualistic artists, deeply rooted in the past, absorbed from the surrounding dominant culture many of the aesthetic elements of world art. Native American painting, a spiritual affirmation of Indianness, became the most innova-

tive and creative of any of the forms of Indian art."

The decades of artistic expression that were considered in Silberman's retrospective are revisited in "The First 100 Years: Southern Plains Painting and Drawing."

The 30 displayed works include examples of Fort Marion ledger art, drawings by the Kiowa artist Silver Horn, paintings by various Kiowa Five artists and those within the sphere of Muskogee, Oklahoma's Bacone College, and works produced by selftaught Oklahoma Indian painters.

Due to the age and fragile nature of the Fort Marion and Silver Horn works, 10 images by these artists will be displayed through July 27. They will be replaced by 10 different works that will remain on view through Oct. 8. ## Air quality issues publication now available for animal agriculture

COLLEGE STATION — To help inform operators of animal feeding facilities about state and federal air quality regulations, a brochure titled "Air Quality Standards and Nuisance Issues for Animal Agriculture" has been published by Texas Cooperative Extension.

"As animal feeding operations in Texas and other states are growing in size and concentration, air quality standards are being strictly enforced," said Dr. Saqib Mukhtar, Extension agricultural engineer.

The concentration of livestock and poultry confinement facilities began in the 1990s, Mukhtar said. These operations may face increased scrutiny and accountability for impairing the air quality for neighbors and communities, so producers need information on air quality standards and reporting requirements.

The five-page publication was written by Mukhtar and Dr. Brent Auvermann, Extension agricultural engineer. The Clean Air Act, basic air quality principles and new ammonia and hydrogen sulfide reporting requirements are also covered, Mukhtar said.







## HOME FRONT Some veterans trading combat for classrooms

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — Within a year, Luke Miller went from raiding insurgent strongholds in Iraq's volatile Anbar province to preparing math final exams for seventh and eighth graders at West Junior High School.

During a pre-algebra class before school broke for the summer, Miller drew from an

Iraq-inspired scenario to show his students the calculation for rate-of-speed by using the example of a soldier lost in the desert who must accelerate his pace to reunite with his platoon.

Miller, a national guard Marine reservist who served as a tank commander, is one of a growing number of troops returning from combat who are trading the battlefield for the classroom. They are drawn to teaching by a credo they picked up in the military: Help the ones who follow behind.

Many troops enter through a federal program called Troops to Teachers, which places veterans and reservists with college

degrees in teacher certification classes. More than 1,500 graduates — and many more combat veterans unaffiliated with the program, like Miller — are working in schools across the West, from California to Colorado, said director John Gantz. More than 4,500 are teaching in the South.

And those numbers are expected to climb, Gantz said.

Miller, 26, landed his first teaching job three months before he was deployed to Iraq in 2004. His unit, Alpha Company, 1st Tank Battalion, 2nd Marine Division, served 200 days last year in Hit, Iraq, and he was awarded the prestigious Military Vanguard Award and a Bronze Star after rescuing three comrades wounded in a roadside bomb attack.

Combat experience, he said, has bolstered an approach to teaching that draws frequently from lessons learned in war. Schools are successfully staving off the shortfall by expanding recruitment efforts beyond the college pipeline. In addition to the thousands of military veterans, many of the vacancies will be plugged by a nontraditional group of mid-career professionals and retirees.

There is a deep reservoir to tap. Since 2001, some 240,000 veterans with college degrees have left the armed forces.

Troops to Teachers, whose mantra is "proud to serve again," offers a \$5,000 stipend, plus another \$10,000 if graduates choose to teach in impoverished areas. The program was created in 1994, but was dormant for six years until Congress reauthorized spending in 2001 to help lure the type of "highly qualified" teachers required by the No Child Left Behind Act.

The program has produced 9,000 teachers nationally. More than 75 percent are still teaching — a rate that far outpaces traditional teacher retention of less than 50 percent, according to a 2002 University of Pennsylvania study cited by the group.

While men and minorities are underrepresented in the national applicant pool of teachers — only 18 percent male, and 15 percent minority — military teachers placed by Troops to Teachers are overwhelmingly

Nationally, a looming teacher shortage could befall American schools. According to Department of Education projections, 2 million teachers will be needed to staff mostly inner-city and rural schools in the next 10 years. men; some 37 percent are minorities.

School officials cite maturity and effective discipline techniques as unique skills that veterans bring to the job.

"They've been through a lot more than somebody just out of college," said Phil Wickliff, veterans education coordinator for the Idaho Department of Education. "If I was a superintendent hiring a teacher, I'd be much likelier to hire ex-military than a young person right out of Boise State (University) who just doesn't have that life experience."


