today to extend the USA Patriot Act, the
government's premier anti-terrorism law, government's premier anti-terrorism law,
before its major provisions expire at the before its major
end of the month. end of the month. "All factors considered it's reasonably good, not perfect, but it's acceptable," said
Sen. Arlen Specter, R-Pa., and chairman of the Judiciary Committee, as he announced the deal.
The agreement would extend for four years two of the Patriot Act's most contro versial provisions - authorizing roving
wiretaps and permitting secret warrants for books, records and other items from businesses, hospitals and organizations such as libraries. Those provisions would expire in four years unless Congress acts on them
again.

Another of the fear factors that worried most at the time was hint that a change in Program Directors was on the horizon. PD's were the head coaches of the air staff back in the day. If ratings weren't rising, upper management or own-
ership would effect change beginning with ership would effect change beginning with
the office down the hall. After all, ratings the office down t.
provide revenue.
This was particularly troubling to the air staff, which was usually the problem in the first place. A new Program Director often meant more than replacing the nameplate
on the door and changing the building entr on the door and changing the building entry
code. New PD's had a reputation for 'cleaning house'. It was not uncommon for these people to come in and hold one-on-one meetings that commonly began with "If you were in charge, what would you do?": More often than not, they ended with severance check.
Knowing a new PD was coming gin would
literally suck the creativity and life out of an air staff. Performance levels would drop. Most would show up only to go through the motions, if they showed up at all. Nothing would function as it should until the office changes complete.
When head coach Gary Barnett and his Colorado Buffatoes lost to Iowa State, it didn't shock me. The Cyclones are a very good football team. CU losing to Nebraska at home was painful. How do you let the
Huskers come into your house and slap you
around like that? And then there was Texas.

## Economy: Jobless claims rise

WASHINGTON (AP) - The num- ber of Americans who have lost jobs from a string of devastating hurricanes rose to 599,700 last week as the effects of Katrina and Rita continued to be felt months after they slammed

ashore.
