## Enchilada Pie

2 lb . ground beef
1 med. onion, finely chopped $1 / 2$ tsp. garlic powder
1-8 oz. can tomato sauce
2 C. canned tomatoes, chopped or diced
1-4 oz. can chopped chilies (drained)
1-1-1/2 oz. pkg, taco seasoning mix
$1 / 2$ tsp. salt
$1 / 4$ tsp. black pepper
1 T. chili powder
1-14 oz. pkg. corn tortillas (torn into eighths)
1 can cream of chicken soup $3 / 4$ C. milk
2 C. shredded cheddar cheese
Brown ground beef, onion and garlic powder in skillet, stirring frequently; drain. Add tomato sauce, tomatoes, chilies, taco seasoning, salt, pepper and chili powder, mixing well. simmer for five minutes, stirring occasionally. Layer half the tortillas, all the ground beef mixture and the remaining tortillas in a 9 x 13 baking dish. Pour the soup and milk over the layers and sprinkle with cheese. Bake at 350 for 45 minutes.
