The 1998 Borden County Junior Livestock Show was held in Gail this past weekend. There were 155 animals exhibited by 4-H and FFA members ranging from grades three through twelve.

On Thursday evening, as the crowd begin to arrive, they were pleased to see the new renovation of the show barn. With the new dropped ceiling, lighting and central heater's added to improve the structure.

Announcer Charles McCook started the show on Thursday evening with a call for the 23 steers to enter the ring to be judged by Bryan Reynolds, CEA-AG, Lynn County.

On Friday morning, beginning at 8:30 a.m. 21 lambs were ready to be judged by Russell Kott, CEA-Ag, Sterling City. The Swine show followed at 10:30 a.m. with Denny Belew, Ag Teacher, Tahoka, judging the 111 swine.

Earlier in the week all livestock were classified by Don Richardson, retired CEA-AG, Howard County. Mr. Danny Preston of Tahoka served as Showmanship judge throughout the entire showing of the animals.

Throughout the show each breed champion received a feed bucket and scoop donated by Bill and Mary John Phinizy and Moor-Man feed.

Borden County Jr. High Basketball Teams Participate in O'Donnell Tournament

The Borden County Jr. High Missy Coyotes and Pup Coyotes traveled to O'Donnell, Saturday, Jan. 10 to play in the O'Donnell Jr. High one-day tournament.

In this tournament, the Pups opened with the Dawson Dragons. After a very convincing victory over the young Dragons, the Pups played the host team in the Championship game.

First Game Against Dawson

In the first round of the tournament the Missy Coyotes were matched with the Missy Dragons from Dawson. A good offensive first quarter allowed the Missys a 10-point lead with 18 points and the defense allowed the Missy Dragons only 8 points.

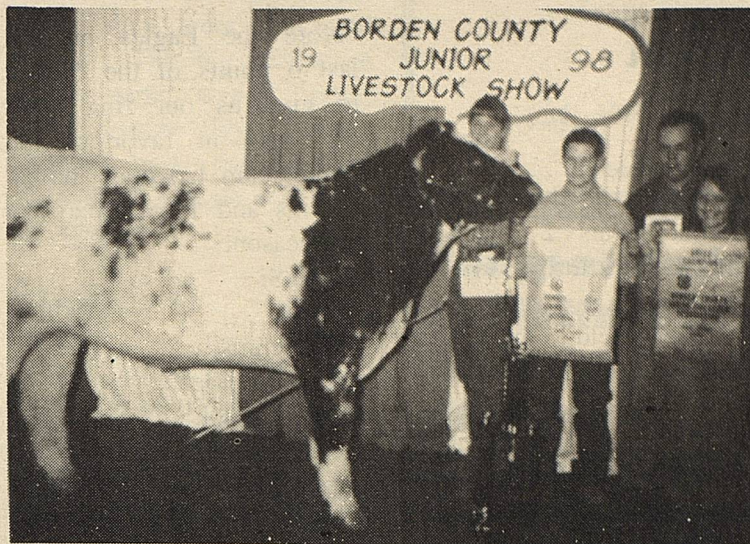

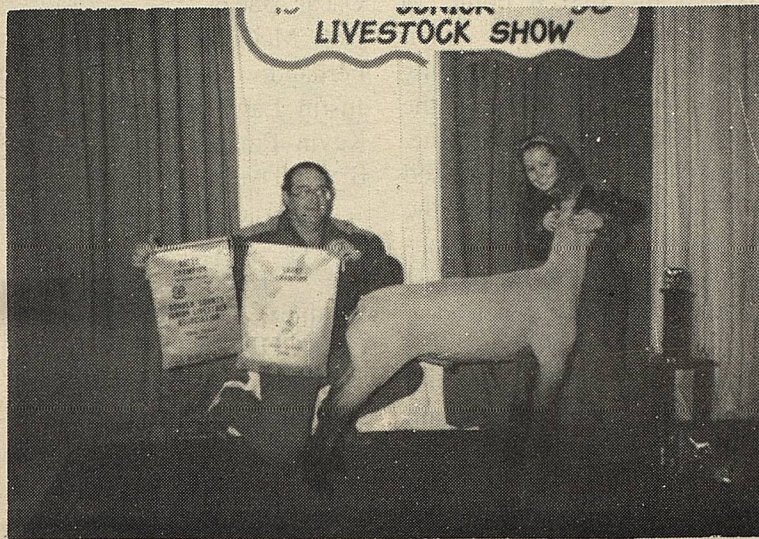

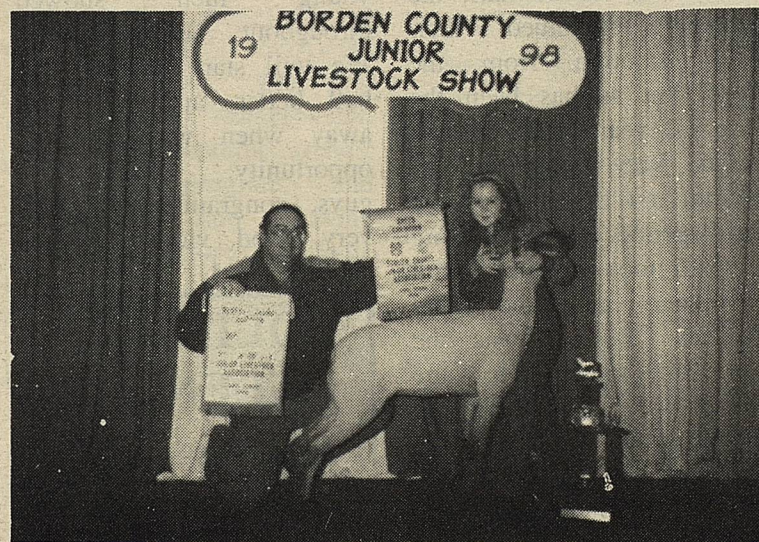
GRAND CHAMPION STEER: Kaci Poole exhibits her heavy weight European as the 1998 Grand Champion Steer



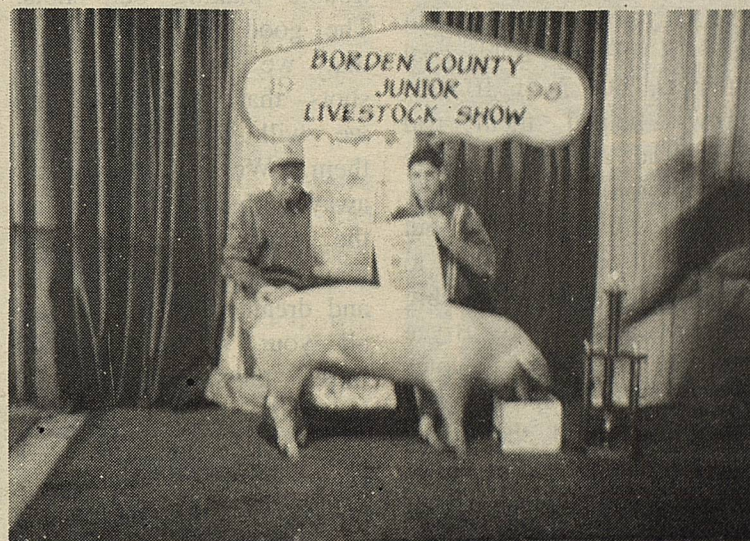
RESERVE CHAMPION STEER: Carey Cox received the Reserve Champion with her light weight European Steer.

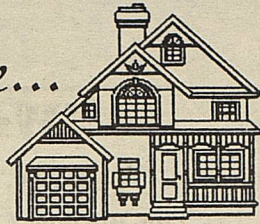

Barn Dance To Be Held January 24th

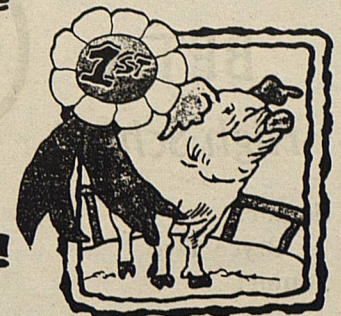

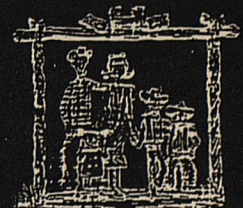
