## Title 1 funds eyed

 by local educatorsBy De dean Special to The News Local educators are waiting and watching to see if the November election results will affect the Pampa Independent School almost \$1 million received each year to enhance education for disadvantaged students. Six of Pampa's seven public school campuses qualify for and receive Title Elementary, according to Kathy Carter, Pampa ISD director of secondary curriculum.

That means approximate$\$ 800,000$ additional money coming into the district each year, Carter said.
To qualify for Title funds, more than 40 percent of students on campus must be eligible for free or reduced lunches.

funds, approximately $\$ 500,000$ each year, pay all or a portion of salaries for
additional teachers and facilitators of specialized programs to help low income and disadvantaged students, Carter said.
It pays for parent liaisons campuses. It pays for parental involvement coordinator for the district and for a full-time translator. A portion of the Homeless and
Drug \& Alcohol Educator's salary is paid with Title salary is paid with Title 1
funds. "On each Title 1 campus, ure - part of the Reading Recovery teacher's pay, an interventionist, and a couple
of teachers at the elementary evel," Carter said.
Title 1 monies also pay for contractual training and staff development, supplies for campuses and parental involvement programs, and expenses for teacher training and for students, she said. The remaining Title 1 funds are divided among the campuses according to the percentage of qualifying stu-
dents, she said. dents, she said.
"Every campus can do
what it wants (with the funds), usually computers and software or specialized urriculum," she said.

who was president of the school board. He who was president of the school board. He
was also the architect for Pampa's City Hall was also the architect for Pampa's City Hall
and the Gray County Court House which were part of the buildings known as "Million Dollar Row." The exterior brick is the same as that used on Pampa's first high school. The house, which cost about $\$ 60,000$, was constructed of steel beams and concrete.
The interior walls are construction brick covered by wood lathe and plaster. There is no wood construction on the exterior of the
house other than the windows.
In 1931, the home was purchased by Tom In 1931, the home was purchased by Tom
Rose and in 1951 became the home of Rex and Maxine Rose. Their daughter, Mary Jane Rose Johnson, a world-renowned soprano and opera star, grew up in the home. In January 2001, Keith and Melinda Stowers bought the property and undertook a
major restoration that included the addition of two circle driveways, iron and wood fences, a second garage and a portico that covers the sunroom entrance. The red clay tile roof was matched for the new garage and portico with tile purchased from an old Santa e train depot.
