## **Rotary Club plans** welcoming signs

Chuck White and the Pampa Rotary Club want to build welcoming signs to Pampa at five different entrances to the city.

The Pampa Rotary Club had initially volunteered to head a project to replace the welcome sign on U.S. Highway 60 at Sundown Park on the west side of town after it was destroyed by a runaway truck a decade ago.

Appearing before the Pampa City Commission Tuesday afternoon, White, who heads the Rotary committee on the project, told commissioners he would like to see signs welcoming visitors to Pampa on the Texas Highway 70 entrances to the city on both the north and south ends of town and on U.S. 60 on the east and west sides of Pampa and on Farmto-Market Road 152 on the west side of town. He estimated that the five

signs, most likely with mar-

ble and brick, would cost about \$125,000. He said he thought the money could be raised from the city, Gray the Pampa County, Economic Development Corporation and through private donations.

Pampa City Manager John Horst told commissioners that the city already had \$6,000 from an insurance settlement over the destruction of the sign struck by the truck and that increased sales tax money might be available for such a project if they wished.

White presented an artist's rendering of a marble and brick monument 24-feet wide and 9-feet tall with a waterfall, trees, shrubs and one flag pole that had been drawn up by West Texas Landscape. He said that while he thought the quality of the monument was great, he thought the \$65,000 price tag was too much, even Texas West though

AMARILLO -- The market director of the Texas Cattle Feeders Association said this week that there should be little or no change for retail beef prices next year.

Jim Gill with the cattle feeders association said consumers, on average, paid less this year than last for beef.

"It is likely," he said, "that 2007's retail beef price will show very little change from this year."

Retail beef prices averaged \$3.98 per pound in 2006, down 10 cents from the \$4.08 in 1005.

For cattle feeders, Gill's prediction is very much the same.

He said fed cattle prices should stay in a price similar to 2006.

Gill said fed cattle prices should range from \$78 to \$86 in the first quarter, \$82 to \$88 in the second quarter; \$84 to \$90 in the third quarter and \$86 to \$94 in the fourth quarter of 2007.

"Fed cattle prices during 2006 averaged near \$86 per cwt. with a range from \$78 to \$98 during the year," Gill said.

More beef has been coming to ·market because of heavier cattle, but Gill said harvest weights of cattle should trend lower because of higher feed costs.


The price of corn, the second major variable in cattle feeding after the purchase of the cattle, has risen

due to demand for the grain in ethanol production.

He said ranchers have seen prices for their cattle, which are sold to feedyards in this highly segmented business, come under pressure because of higher corn prices.

Gill said he expects there to be fewer cattle going into feedyards as ranchers retain heifers in order to build their herds, although that may

The Jordan Unit was named after long time sheriff Rufe Jordan. He was sheriff for 38 years until he lost reelection in 1988. He died in his sleep at the age of 78 on June 18, 1991. He was known around these parts for his strict code of law and discipline.


This unit opened in October 1992 and currently houses about 1,000 male medium security prisoners. These residents are not transported into town to do community work, but have specific jobs either inside the prison building, outside in the yard, just outside the fence or in the sewing facility housed at the prison which makes state issued boots. None of the prisoners at this facility earn a wage from their jobs or make any money while incarcerated.

Four buildings with three wings each make up the Jordan Unit. A central gurad station near the front door of each building can see all three sections and controls all the doors. Each section consists of 84 cells, 42 on upper See PRISON, Page 3







is where two televisions are available. A shower area is off to the side of each wing and the guard can see everything going on in there as well.

All of the cells are the same with the approximate size being 8 x 10. They have bunk beds, stool and table and toilet. To be placed in a cell together, the men's differences have to be no more than 8 years in age, 40 pounds in weight and 7 inches in height. Personal items that are allowed in the cell are clear radios and fans (so nothing can be hidden inside), a typewriter and books. A count (of people) is done eight times a day and randomly picked cells are inspected every 72 hours. Lights out, which is controlled by a guard, is done at 10:30 p.m. on weeknights

and 1 a.m. on weekends. Everyone in the prison has some type of job unless a doctor finds them medically unfit for work.

The maintenance of the building's air conditioning, heating, boilers and plumbing are all done by the inmates themselves.

The closest guard to the inmates is a field supervisor with a rifle. Back a little farther, is a "high rider," a guard mounted on a horse. He also has a rifle at the ready. Even farther back is another officer with a pistol and he has dogs ready to let loose if needed.

Any inmate who does not possess a GED or high

school diploma must attend classes at the prison. There is a "school building" which has multiple classrooms, a library, computers to be used for reading class and a principal's office. The Windham School District conducts the classes with six to eight full time teachers. The computers are used for reading assignments only. They do

not have Internet access. Inmates can have visitors on Saturday or Sunday between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Each visit can only last two hours.

Mail can be sent and received by all prisoners, but the prison staff opens and reads most mail before delivering it to the inmate. The only mail that is not read is legal documents, but a guard is present when it is opened to make sure no contraband is in the envelope.

The prison has a commissary where the inmates can purchase food items such as snacks and sodas. Also available are "hot pots," little containers similar to a coffee pot that can be plugged in and water heated up inside. Since microwaves are not allowed in the cells, water can be heated in these hot pots and poured over food pouches that require heating. All of the food comes in pouches. No metal cans are allowed

In order to have money to spend at the commissary, a friend or family member must place money into a trust fund for that inmate. The inmate is then given a debit card to use (no cash is ever handled) that deducts the amount spent from the account. A prisoner can spend up to \$75 every two

Once again meals on Wheels is sponsoring a program for the Holidays that allows individuals to pay for patrons that are presently receiving meals, but do not have the ability to pay, or can only pay the minimum of 25 cents per meal. This is approximately 60 percent of the patrons.

Patrons have the need of a warm, nutritious meal which has to be addressed daily. The cost of each meal averages \$4. This leaves a large deficit for each meal.

Religion is important to many prisoners and nondenominational church services are offered on Sundays. Volunteers from various churches in the community also come out and visit the prisoners. No prisoner is forced to attend religious ceremonies. This is one item that is purely voluntary. A prison chaplain is also available.

Sports such as basketball and handball are part of the recreation program provided. The G1 and G2 inmates can go outside three hours in the morning and three hours in the afternoon. The G4 inmates are only allowed outside for two hours in the morning. All of these recreation breaks are done seven days a week.

If a prisoner does not want to go outside, he can watch television in the TV room of his cell wing. This area has two televisions mounted on either end and multiple chairs. The main guard has the remote control and the program watched is decided by majority vote of those inmates in the room.

If an inmate breaks the rules or acts up, there are many ways the prison can discipline them. Any activity can be restricted. This could mean no mail or visitors for a specified amount of time.

Items such as radios and hot pots can be taken away. Recreation and TV time can be limited for up to 90 days if needed. The harshest punishment would be to put a prisoner in solitary confinement and this can be done for up to 15 days at a time.

The Jordan Unit is currently under the direction and supervision of Warden Tim Simmons. He has worked in the prison system for 24 years. Ten of those years he was an assistant warden and he has been a warden for the past three years.

The Pampa prison is the seventh he has worked at and he has been here for about a year and a half. He, his wife and four children moved here from the Huntsville area.



### Iraq Study Group not a secret like Pentagon Papers tried to be

The report by the Iraq Study Group has caused some consternapoliticos and tion among American citizens. Both sides of the political spectrum have taken sides and President Bush is being pressured to take action on the report.

At least this report on an unpopular war is out in the open and people can make up their own minds about whether the recommendations should be accepted or not.

That was not the case on a similar study during the Vietnam War which became what has been called one of the great whistleblower sagas.

In 1967 then Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara ordered the Pentagon to do a study of America's involvement in Vietnam.

The result was a 47-volume, 7,000-page top secret document called the Pentagon Papers that detailed the United States' political ships on routine patrol in interna-

Vietnam from 1945 to 1971. Its focus was on internal planning and policy decisions in the U.S. Government.

Leslie H. Gelb, director of policy planning for the Pentagon, headed up the project. He hired 36 military experts, civilian experts and historians to write the report.

The massive work revealed that the government had increased its credibility gap by expanding its role in Vietnam long before the public was told about the actions and while President Lyndon Johnson was promising not to expand the war.

Lies and deceptions from government officials at the time continued. For instance, the war is going well was the official line. even though it was not. Also, President Johnson, in 1964, told Congress that the North Vietnamese had attacked U.S.

and military involvement in tional waters in the Gulf of Tonkin. Adviser Henry Kissinger, about the It was later learned that the U.S. ships that were attacked were on a secret intelligence mission in North Vietnam's territorial waters.



Congress used that claim to expand the war that eventually claimed the lives of more than 50,000 American troops and two million Vietnamese.

Daniel Ellsberg had served in Vietnam and worked for the Pentagon and the Rand Corp. He had access to the Pentagon Papers and knew that the U.S. policy in Vietnam was misguided.

He approached numerous officials, including National Security secret report and was met with disinterest.

As opposition to the war increased in the late '60s, Ellsberg knew he had to get the word out.

He painstakingly copied all 7,000 pages of the document and finally leaked them to The New York Times after all the politicians he approached said they were not interested.

The first installment was printed on June 13, 1971.

The Nixon administration immediately got an injunction to halt publication, the first such prior restraint in U.S. history. Of course, that piqued the interest of many Americans who wanted to know what the report was hiding.

The legal battle finally ended on June 30, 1971, when the Supreme Court voted to lift the prior restraints on a 6-3 decision.

Ellsberg became a marked man. He was indicted along with colleague Anthony Russo, who helped copy the documents. Surprisingly, Ellsberg's lawyers discovered that it was not a crime to leak government documents.

Nixon was incensed that Ellsberg blew the whistle, even though the report did not mention Nixon's involvement, only that of his predecessors.

As part of his hatred of Ellsberg, a burglary of Ellsberg's psychiatrist's office was undertaken by "plumbers," a secret unit set up in the White House. When this became public, a judge dismissed the case against Ellsberg.

Nixon soon became embroiled in the Watergate scandal and resigned in 1974.

That was a sad era in our government's past. Power corrupts and absolute power corrupts absolutely. Arrogance seemed to rule the day.

That is why I was pleased to see See SECRETS, Page 7





# Texas prepares for possible pandemic flu outbreak

### By JAMIE STENGLE Associated Press Writer

DALLAS (AP) — With a statewide drill planned for next year to test Texas' preparedness for a possible pandemic flu outbreak, health officials are continuing to tweak the state's response plan.

Several similar drills have already been done locally and regionally.

"With pandemic flu, so much of it starts out as a local response," said Emily

Palmer, spokeswoman for the Texas that the Asian bird flu could cause a pan-Department of State Health Services, which is heading up the response to a possible pandemic.

The state plan has been in place since 2004 and updated several times since. Local health departments, hospitals, businesses and schools also have prepared their own plans in coordination with the state.

A pandemic flu outbreak occurs when a new, highly contagious form of the flu virus emerges. There is heightened concern demic if it starts easily spreading among humans.

In the last century there were three flu pandemics, the worst being a 1918 outbreak that killed about 50 million people worldwide, and 500,000 in the U.S.


Cherise Rohr-Allegrini, epidemiologist at the San Antonio Metro Health District, said that the department has been working not only with city and county agencies to help them come up with preparedness

plans, but also with schools and businesses.

"A large part of our preparedness is making sure other people are prepared," Rohr-Allegrini said.

In Dallas, the city is working on a plan to fill spots if a third of the work force is out sick or caring for a sick person. For instance, library personnel, who would not be essential during a pandemic, could be trained to be 911 operators, said Kenny


be awarded.





Shaw, director of the city's office of emergency management.

In West Texas, about 120 people attended the Ector County Health Department's two-day flu summit at the end of November, said Sallie Connor, public health preparedness program manager for the department.

The state's plan estimates that an international outbreak of a new variation of the flu could have a 25 to 50 percent attack rate, meaning 5 to 10 million Texans could get sick. Of those, 4 percent between 200,000 to 400,000 — might have to be hospitalized. Between 75,000 to 500,000 Texans could die.

The plan notes that while local communities are considering alternatives to provide care for the sick, there won't be enough hospital beds for the severely ill. The Texas Hospital Association says the state's 554 hospitals have about 77,000 beds. Most people would have to be cared for at home.

But during a pandemic, health officials say staffing the hospitals --rather than a shortage of are made at a last minute."

beds - will be the biggest problem.

Rohr-Allegrini said hospital staff will need training to take on extra duties in case many other employees are unable to report to work.

Among points still to be completed are how many extra antivirals Texas will order. Antivirals like Tamiflu can be used to reduce flu symptoms and can also help protect against it. The state already has access to about 3.3 million antivirals as part of the national stockpile.

Officials are in the process of tweaking the guidelines for who will get antivirals, both as a precaution and a treatment.

Much of the planning for a pandemic — which could last up to a year with two waves of outbreaks ---will depend on various factors, including how much warning is available before the pandemic strikes and its severity, Palmer said. It is also unknown whether antivirals would be effective against whatever strain hits and how long it might take to get a vaccine.

"Everybody would go into their response planning mode," Palmer said. "I know there's going to be a lot of decisions that

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — After years of optimistic claims from Washington, Iraq is ending 2006 with the American strategy in shambles and a politically weakened Bush administration struggling for a way out of the impasse.

Sectarian slaughter rages in Baghdad and religiously mixed areas, carried out by shadowy militias and death squads believed linked to Shiite and Sunni politicians and clerics. Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki has done little to curb the militias.

In the dusty towns of Anbar province, Sunni Arab insurgents ambush American and Iraqi forces daily. An estimated 100,000 Iraqis flee the country every month to escape the violence, according to the Washington-based Refugees International. The U.S. death toll neared

### **Appalachian State wins second title, 28-17 over UMass**

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. (AP) — Appalachian State has found a second home in the national championship game.

The Mountaineers won their second straight NCAA Division I-AA title with a 28-17 victory over Massachusetts on Friday night in front of a record-breaking crowd loaded with Appalachian State fans

Officials had to bring in temporary bleachers to hold all the Mountaineers' supporters, and as the final second ticked off the clock, most of them streamed onto the field to celebrate with fireworks going off over head.

"It was like playing at home almost. We had such a great following over here," Mountaineers coach Jerry Moore said. "It was just an awesome feeling all night long." The attendance of 22,808 was

the largest since the game moved to Chattanooga in 1997. And the Mountaineers may be

back next year with most of their top offensive players returning.

Kevin Richardson wanted to enjoy the trophy longer, so he carried it out of the locker room and plunked it down on the interview table.

"A couple of guys had the trophy in the locker room, and I was like 'Why not? Let's bring it over here and let you all look at it," Richardson said.

Appalachian State (14-1) is the first team to take home the newly named NCAA Division I Football Championship. The NCAA is phasing out the terms Divisions I-A and I-AA that applied to football. I-A is now the Football Bowl Subdivision, while I-AA is the Championship Football Subdivision.

Georgia Southern was the last team to win consecutive crowns in 1999 and 2000.

The Minutemen (13-2) were hoping to win their first title since 1998.

2003. He finished with 30.


Richardson hurt his shoulder during last week's semifinal game, but he didn't appear to have any problems Friday.

The situation has become so desperate that some U.S. politicians believe the best course is to give up on a unified Iraq and partition the country along religious and ethnic lines - even though the idea finds little support among the majority of Iraqis.

That bleak reality is vastly different from what U.S. officials were hoping for a year ago.

With a new constitution ratified and a freely elected parliament in place, hopes ran high that 2006 would mark a turning point in the U.S. campaign to build a stable democracy on the wreckage of Saddam Hussein's dictatorship.

U.S. officials even spoke of reducing U.S. troop strength in Iraq below

100,000 by the end of 2006, and Iraq's national security adviser confidently assured reporters of a "sizable gross reduction" in American forces here.

Those hopes were dashed after Feb. 22 when Sunni Arab extremists blew up a sacred Shiite shrine in Samarra, a Sunni city north of Baghdad. That brazen attack outraged the country's long-suffering Shiite majority, which had endured suicide attacks, car bombings and assassinations by Sunni religious extremists, including al-Qaida in Iraq.

The Samarra blast triggered a wave of sectarian reprisal killings that has led many scholars and political analysts to conclude that the country is now in a lowintensity civil war - with the 140,000 U.S. troops caught in the middle.

In the wake of Samarra, Iraq's leading Shiite clerics,

who had cautioned patience during years of vicious sectarian attacks, could no longer curb the tide of Shiite retribution.

With the Iraqi army and police riddled with Shiite militiamen, many Sunnis saw the security operation as a cover to crack down on their community. Many Sunnis who had stayed out of the insurgency took up arms to protect their neighborhoods. Many Shiites did the same.

The crackdown faltered, forcing the U.S. command to send thousands of American soldiers into the streets, some from flashpoints in the insurgent-ridden Anbar province.

The bombing and the frenzied vendetta that followed also sabotaged American the December parliamentary

process of forming a government of national unity after

elections.

U.S. Ambassador Zalmay Khalilzad, who had worked tirelessly to promote a political agreement, said repeatedly that a unity government of Shiites, Sunnis and Kurds offered the best chance for Iraq to build a stable democracy on the wreckage of Saddam Hussein's dictatorship.

Although negotiations continued and a government took office three months later, sectarian bitterness runs so deep that al-Maliki has been unable to forge an effective administration and see through a program of national reconciliation.

Instead, political momentum belonged to the sectarian extremists. The United Nations estimated that by last summer, an average of 100 people were dying each day.

Scores of bodies appear almost daily in vacant lots

and sidestreets of the capital, often with horrific signs of torture.

Iragis fear the extremist goal is to divide Baghdad, a religiously and ethnically mixed city, into a mostly Shiite zone east of the Tigris river and a largely Sunni area to the west.

Al-Maliki promised to restore order and as one of his first acts, he announced a major crackdown to rid the capital of the killers. He cited the threat posed by al-Qaida and other Sunni religious extremists.

That angered Sunni leaders, who complained that the real threat was posed by Shiite militias, including the Mahdi Army of radical anti-American cleric Muqtada al-Sadr, a close al-Maliki ally.


With the Iraqi army and police riddled with Shiite militiamen, many Sunnis saw the security operation as a cover to crack down on their community. Many Sunnis who had stayed out of the insurgency took up arms to protect their neighborhoods. Many Shiites did the same.

### **Business students** design software

CANYON - Students of computer science (CS) and computer information systems (CIS) at West Texas A&M University must pursue a mutual capstone course in which they are challenged to solve a real problem in software engineering.

The Meat Lab at West Texas A&M University had such a problem - no electropic means of tracking its meat products to comply with the USDA's National Animal Identification System (NAIS).

"We've been using a manual system that is paper intensive, with no inventory tracking system," Dr. Ty Lawrence, assistant professor of animal science, said. "Now, thanks to this capstone course and the students in it, we have awesome new software providing carcassto-cut information. It's a definite boon to the Meat Lab

and the Department of Agricultural Sciences.

"And equally important is its benefit to students in the College of Business," he said. "I asked them if they learned anything, if it was hard and if it was a real-life problem, and they answered 'yes' to each of the guestions."

Students first priced software capable of solving the Meat Lab's problem of tracking cuts of meat after harvest. They found something for about \$20,000, but their budget was only half that amount.

"It became apparent right off that they were going to have to develop the software themselves," Jeremy Pauli, instructor of CIS and teacher of the capstone class, said.

The group worked for approximately the last three months on the project, analyzing the problem, then designing and building the software. The end result is a system capable of not only tracking all the cuts that come from an animal, it also provides for a retail Point of Sale (PoS) capability.

The system is divided into two parts that share one database. The first part is the Inventory Management System (IMS) that allows Meat Lab staff to input animal, carcass and cut information as the normal processing occurs. The second part of the system, the Point of Sale, provides traditional retail functionality - entering orders, accepting payment and viewing reports of sales and inventory levels.

"The combination of the IMS and PoS provide the Meat Lab with a solution that puts them several years ahead of USDA requirements," Pauli said. "This will serve as a learning opportunity for agricultural students as well as CIS and CS students."

ABILENE — Sixty-mile-an-hour sandstorms, 130-degree heat and months without a glimpse of family and friends was just the beginning of some of the things the son of a Pampa couple endured during a recent mission to support Operation Iraqi Freedom.





Pampa High School. "We worked in conditions of up to 130-degree temperatures with sand storms that completely blocked visibility at times."

The men and women at Dyess make up the 7th Bomb Wing, a B-1B Lancer bomber unit. Airmen at Dyess were deployed at numerous locations throughout the region, ranging from an island in the Indian Ocean to outlying forward operating bases north of Baghdad. Air Force participation in

the war on terror now includes much more than simply dropping bombs on a target. Close air support for soldiers on the ground, convoy duty, detainee operations, explosive ordnance disposal, medical care, even security forces operations are now routine duties for Air Force men and women.

"Keeping our ground troops alive was our number one priority. It was very important for us to build every bomb without error, because when the troops asked for close-air ground support from our bombers, we had to be there for them. The thing that kept me going throughout my deployment was knowing that these bombs helped keep a little boy or little girl's Dad or Mom alive."

While 12-to-16 hour work days didn't leave much time to dwell on what they missed back home, the Dyess airmen felt a void that put

added stress on an already stressful time in their lives. "The thing I missed most while I was deployed was my family," said Reed. "My children Bradyn and Mycala were constantly on my mind and my wife was on my

### **Book chronicles historic courthouses within the Lone Star State**

WHARTON, Texas (AP) -When Wharton County Judge W.J. Croom and his commissioners announced plans to build a new rancher courthouse, Able "Shanghai" Pierce raised such a ruckus the governor called in the Texas Rangers to keep the peace.

When Pierce got an injunction to save the old wooden courthouse, the judge and commissioners cut a hole in the roof in an effort to flee and avoid being served, but the judge got stuck in the hole.

Everything ended peacefully in the 1888 squabble. The judge was unstuck. A settlement was reached. A new courthouse was built the following year.

Almost 120 years later, the restoration of that courthouse is nearing completion. It should be rededicated early in 2007, the latest in a series of restorations of historic

Texas courthouses.

The Wharton County Courthouse is among 100 profiled in "Historic Texas Courthouses," a 276-page coffee table book written by attorney and former Houston Congressman Michael Andrews and illustrated by architectural photographers Paul Hester and Lisa Hardaway.

"I've always loved Texas history and have been fascinated by these great old buildings," said Andrews, 62, whose congressional career ended in 1994.

"Traveling around the state, I would see these buildings and always be curious about how did that get there and what happened," he said. "The more I looked into it, I found very little has been written about these individual counties, the architects who designed the buildings and about the buildings themselves, what these structures really

meant in early Texas."

What became apparent to Andrews was that for Texans up until about World War II, the county government had a much larger impact on a family's life. The courthouse for a society far less transitory became the repository for someone's life, from birth certificate, marriage license, other legal documents and finally to death certificate.

"It was more than a structure," Andrews said. "But as a structure, the courthouse became the predominant symbol of a county's life, of its culture, of its pride."

As a result, Texas and its 254 counties wound up with some magnificent architecture.

England-born architect Alfred Giles, whose style is marked by symmetry and art, is credited as the designer of the famous landmark courthouse in Presidio County,

where cattle outnumbered residents almost 1,000-to-1 in 1885 when Marfa was selected county seat. The courthouse, described by Andrews as "one of the state's most prized," dominated the landscape.

"There was no town, just the courthouse," Andrews said. "The people there spent their resources to build this majestic courthouse in the middle of nowhere. It was the way people would find their way across the desert — the sight of this courthouse."

In 1910, a celebration was held at the courthouse to mark the arrival of electricity.

Other Giles courthouses are in Laredo and Falfurrias.

"Especially toward end of the 19th century, when wealth started coming to different counties in Texas, county leaders would compete with each other to see what kind

of majestic courthouses they can build," said Andrews, who describes it as the Golden Age for Texas courthouses.

"At no other time in Texas history has public architecture so clearly defined an era," Andrews writes. "Many of the elegant and monumental buildings that remain still dominate and symbolize their communities today, just as they did when their doors first opened."

There's plenty of history associated with the courthouses.

In 1922, Nathan Lee became the last convicted killer in the state to be legally hanged, in front of the Brazoria County Courthouse, for killing a local farmer. In 1948, a young Texas congressman named Lyndon Johnson began his successful U.S. Senate campaign in front of the Shelby County Courthouse.

No one will mistake Dodge's new sport utility vehicle for a soft, crossover version. The Nitro is boldly styled, with an exaggerated front bumper, an aggressive grille,

black door handles, and sizable fender flares. Chromed, 20-inch wheels are also offered. It's determinedly macho.

Dodge, the manufacturer of well-known

dude vehicles such as the burly Ram truck, wouldn't produce a wimpy SUV.

And it doesn't skimp on safety features. The standard, five-passenger Nitro comes with air bags and stability control, which helped it earn a five-out-of-five-stars rating in federal safety tests.

The vehicle also can come equipped with more computer power than many people have at home — for music, videos and on-

board consumer information.

Its price tag is at the lower end of the SUV range.

The starting manufacturer's suggested retail price, including delivery, is \$19,885. This is for a two-wheel-drive model with a six-cylinder, 210-horsepower and a manual transmission.

Models with four-speed automatic transmissions start at \$20,710. All-wheel-drives, with manual transmissions, start at \$21,395. Automatics start at \$22,220.

Listed under Dodge's larger, Durango SUV, the Nitro is meant to compete with masculine, boxy SUVs such as the 2007 Nissan Xterra, which starts at \$20,665 for a base model with 261-horsepower; and the 2007 Hummer H3, starting at \$29,995 with 242-horsepower, five-cylinder engine and standard four-wheel-drive.

There are three Nitro versions: SXT, SLT and R/T.



### Mallard ducks die mysteriously along Idaho creek

The Idaho Department of Fish and Game and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security were testing tissue samples Wednesday, hoping to rule out an avian flu outbreak.

The ducks mysteriously began dying last week around Land Springs Creek, near the remote town of Oakley, about 180 miles southeast of Boise.

Some migratory mallards from Canada and their local cousins were still perishing at the creek Wednesday, staggering and struggling to breathe before collapsing, said Dave Parrish, regional supervisor for Fish and Game.

"I've never seen anything like this in 20 years here," he said. "There were dead mallards everywhere — in the water and on the banks. It was odd, they were in a very small area."

The massive outbreak is vexing scientists because

Tissue from the ducks' intestinal tract and water samples from the creek were sent to the Fish and Wildlife Service national laboratory in Wisconsin, the University of Idaho and Washington

State University. The agencies expect to review test results Thursday to determine the cause of death.

Mark Drew, a wildlife veterinarian with the state Department of Agriculture, said the ducks likely were exposed to a single contamination source and gathered at the creek, their mutual roosting point, to die. He did not suspect the mallards were passing a contagious virus.

The ducks may have contracted a bacterial or fungal infection by eating grain treated with pesticides by local cattle farmers, Drew said. Farming chemicals may also have spilled into the small spring-fed creek. which measures just 3- to 6inches deep.

The agencies posted signs warning hunters not to eat any birds killed near the creek.

"I'd say there's no reason for alarm in the sense that literally the sky is falling and there's disease spreading," Drew said. "It's unusual in the number of birds and the sense that it's only mallards, but it's nothing that would


DEAR BILL: This couple has deeper problems than a simian in the household. I speak from personal experience when I say that monkeys do not make good house pets. There is no male parent in the picture, and there isn't going to be. Monica is chronically depressed, possibly bipolar, and not entirely capable of taking care of her son. Jimmy,

who was never a slim child, has gained about 100 pounds over the past year. He now weighs nearly 300. Monica and Jimmy eat almost every meal at fast-food restaurants, despite her chronic unemployment and a debt load that recently forced them out of their house. Jimmy isn't sedentary -- he is virtually immobile. Healthful snacks are rare in their apartment, and he drinks soda almost to the exclusion of water. When Jimmy stays with me, we drink water, eat fruits and vegetables, and go outside every day and walk. These activities are nonexistent at Monica's. How can I help this family get healthy before Jimmy's health is further compromised? --**FEARFUL FRIEND IN IDAHO** 

DEAR FEARFUL: You are right to be concerned about that child's welfare. Jimmy needs to be seen and evaluated by a health-care professional because 100 pounds is an enormous amount of weight for anyone -- child or adult -- to put on in one year, and the problem could stem from something other than excess calories. Your friend Monica could be battling chronic depression, or she could -- like many other parents in the United States today -- be ignorant about what healthful meals consist of and how to prepare them. Please encourage her to check into adult education courses in nutrition through her local high school, community college or hospital. As it stands, Jimmy's lifestyle could put him at risk for serious illness, including heart disease and diabetes. If she is unwilling or unable to help her son, then please contact Child Protective Services and let them know the boy needs help in the form of an intervention.



### Drought keeps Texas A caroling we will go cotton crop down

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) - West Texas cotton producer Rickey Bearden lost all 4,000 of his dryland acres to drought, and the lack of rain made his irrigated crop just average.

"I'm considerably down from last year," he said. "Just lack of rainfall."

Growers across Texas, the nation's leading producer of the fluffy fiber, suffered from the drought. Despite the dry conditions, Texas is on track to harvest 5.7 million bales, the state's fourthlargest crop ever, 32 percent below 2005.

The estimates for this year's crop were released Monday by the U.S. Department of Agriculture virtually and were unchanged from last month. They follow back-to-back record years for Texas producers. Last year, the state produced 8.5 million bales, about 700,000 bales more than 2004.

Nationally, the forecast called for 21.3 million bales to be harvested, down 11 percent from last year. Cotton is grown across the nation's Southern tier from Virginia and the Carolinas to California.

When compared with

2005, yields are down in all cotton-producing states except Arizona, Arkansas, California, Tennessee, and Louisiana.

Monday's USDA report projected improved yields from last month for Georgia, Louisiana and Tennessee.

Steven Brown, a cotton specialist at the University of Georgia, said he had expected the heat and drought to reduce average yields in his state to about 500 pounds per acre — barely enough to make one 480pound bale on an acre.

"If the USDA is right, we're going to make a respectable crop," Brown said.

The report says Georgia growers should average 765 pounds per acre, 97 pounds more than the November estimate. It's 85 pounds less than the record 850 pounds last year, but 51 pounds more than the five-year average of 714 pounds.

"We felt like we were on the verge of a disaster," Brown said. "In midsummer, it was very, very depressing. It's good to be better than we thought."

Growers in Arkansas and Tennessee were projected to have record-high production.

### **Texas Forest Service warns** about firewood with oak wilt

encouraging Texans to be careful when collecting and purchasing firewood at this time of year. Transporting and storing diseased wood is a known means of spreading the devastating oak wilt fungus to previously uninfected neighborhoods. Utilizing these prevention steps is the key to safeguarding county and take care not to burn on windy against spreading the disease through the

Red oaks that have died from oak wilt should not be stored or used for firewood. When planning to do any outdoor burning, be sure you check with local officials to see if an outdoor burning ban is in place for your days with low humidity.

selection and use of firewood:

 Select well-seasoned firewood. Well-seasoned wood is cut before the summer and is typically dry with loose bark and cracked ends. Avoid oak wood that appears unseasoned, that may have tight bark and cut ends which show no cracks or signs of aging. The extreme heat and drying of a full Texas summer effectively destroys the fungus in cut firewood.

· Safely store unknown sources of firewood. If the oak wood comes from an unknown source and it is not well seasoned, cover the woodpile with a clear piece of plastic. Burying the edges of the plastic will prevent the entry or exit of insects that might have been attracted to diseased wood and fungal mats.

· Destroy diseased red oaks. A knowledgeable arborist or forester should diagnose red oaks (i.e., Spanish, Texas red, blackjack or shumard oak) that die rapidly (2-3 weeks) or in groups (2 or more trees over several years) for oak wilt. Trees suspected to have died recently from oak wilt should be destroyed by burning, burying or chipping.

 Avoid wounding oaks during vulnerable seasons. The general recommendation is to avoid injuries to oaks from February through June. The best times for pruning of oaks are during the heat of summer (minimal spore production) or the cold of winter (minimal insect activity).

· Paint all oak wounds including pruning cuts. Throughout the year, immediately apply a thin coat of latex or pruning paint to all fresh wounds and other injuries that expose the inner bark or sapwood of oaks. This prevents contaminated sap beetles from infecting the wound with oak wilt spores.

Oak firewood is an important commodity to Texans, whether it's used for firing up the barbecue pit or for warming up the home on a cold winter's day. By selecting well-seasoned, disease-free firewood and by following other disease prevention guidelines, homeowners are taking the correct steps to prevent a new oak wilt disease outbreak in their neighborhood. ### Medical spas move into malls to reach more customers

had been thinking about Botox for a while. So when she spotted a spalike "cosmedical" clinic in the upscale Dallas mall she visits about once a month, she was immediately interested.

When she learned the clinic was connected with one of Texas' leading medical institutions, she was sold.

She had Botox injected into her 32-year-old forehead and near her eyes to smooth out infinitesimal wrinkles.

"It was great. I felt like I was getting a facial," said the furniture showroom manager.

She was hoping to look younger and knew about Botox because several of her friends have had the injections.

Medical spas like the one at Dallas' NorthPark Center are booming. The number in the United States has jumped from 50 in 2002, when Botox injections won federal approval, to about 2,500 this year, according to the International Medical Spa

DALLAS (AP) — Amy Andrade Association. Malls and other retail sites are the hot spot locations as companies and medical institutions move closer to their customers.

Such spas offer minimally invasive cosmetic procedures like injections of Botox, which relaxes facial muscles to make lines fade, and fillers like Restylane, which add volume.

Not all medical spas have ties with a major medical institution like the Klinger Advanced Aesthetics Cosmedical Center, Spa and Salon at NorthPark, which has teamed up with the University of Southwestern Medical Texas Center.

Some "cosmedical" clinics don't even require their practitioners to be plastic surgeons or dermatologists.

Those who specialize in the field say involvement by a plastic surgeon or dermatologist ensures consumer safety.

Dr. Rod Rohrich, professor and chairman of the department of plastic surgery at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center, is one of two plastic surgeons who help oversee cosmetics procedures at the NorthPark operation

"When you peel back 'Botox in the mall,' you have a top-notch medical facility in a mall setting," he said. "What you're doing is you're getting the best of the best in a place where people shop and you're doing it safely.

The doctors are generally there just half a day a week - sometimes more. But they say they are always available for the nurse practitioner, who does most procedures.

Benjamin Akande, dean of Webster University School of Business and Technology in St. Louis, said that it's a business decision that makes sense.

"The partnership with these legitimate entities gives them the kind of credibility that cannot be questioned," Akande said. "They're saying this is as good or better as you coming to your local plastic surgeon."

Moving such procedures closer to consumers also makes sense because "cosmetic surgery in the 21st century is not an anomaly," Akande said. "It's a daily fact of life."

The Klinger spa in Dallas is located across from the Barneys New York store and near Neiman Marcus. It offers haircuts, massages and nail services along with its cosmedical procedures. Botox there starts at \$400 for one area of the face, Restylane at \$650.

Andrade, the 32-year-old who got the Botox treatment, said that she'd made a few phone calls to research the procedure before being drawn in by the sleekly designed spa, which is connected to the Sephora cosmetics store next door.

Almost two weeks after her injections, she said she's been pleased with the results, which she described as a natural look. "I still have expression," she said, while getting rid of some creases between her eyes. "Nobody really notices it except me."

Aware that the results fade in three to five months, she said she'll

decide then whether to do it again. She has gotten some compliments.

"Some people say, 'Oh my God, your skin looks so beautiful."' Her typical reply is that she's been using a new skin product.

Her bottom line, though, is: "I like it, so I think that's what counts."

Botox is the No. 1 minimally invasive cosmetic procedure, with 3.8 million treatments done last year, according to the American Society of Plastic Surgeons.

The International Medical Spa Association estimates that by the end of the year revenue from medical spas will exceed \$1 billion, said Hannelore Leavy, founder and executive director of the group.

The Dallas location is an example of a concept Klinger plans to market to other medical spas and doctor's offices, said Klinger chairman and chief executive officer Richard Rakowski. For a licensing fee, the Norwalk, Conn.-based company plans to put the Klinger name on other spas that adhere to its standards.
