Farmers testing cannon on hail

KINGSBURG, Calif. (AP) $\Longrightarrow$ A thunderous boom from a 20-foot cannon echoes over peach orchards - a sound the peach orchards - a sound the
farmer hopes can save his trees from hail storms. Hail cannons, which switch on when storms are approaching, are the latest high-tech device aimed at protecting crops from the volatile weather that hits
California's agricultural heartland, where a single hail storm can damage a crop and a local economy overnight.
'The first year $I$ had them, there was a storm where I saw my neighbor 's fields had damage and I didn't.

Farmers have long clamored for technology that helps
them deal with nature's whims. Though scientists say no significant study has proven the devices' effectiveness, a small group of farmers in the San Joaquin Valley and across the country are putting faith - and thousands of do
lars - into hail cannons. lars - into hail cannons.

This buying process can only begin by a This buying process can only begin by a fam-
ily member or friend placing an original amount of money in a trust fund.
The inmate has to begin ordering the tools
he will need to make the craft that he has chohe will need to make the craft that he has chosen. This can be a long process in the beginning until he accumulates enough tools to to look through and find what they need. Before the order is placed, the inmate's trust fund is checked to see if there are adequate
funds. If enough money is in that account, the funds. If enough money is in that account, the order is placed and the inmate pays for everything, including taxes and shipping. Once all
of the materials are available, the inmate can begin the actual work.
Those doing woodworking make 'a variety of items. Desk name plaques can be made with a company emblem. Jewelry boxes can have inlayed names on the lid and felt interiors. Clocks can be made in the shape of football
helmets with a favorite team's logo or a pichelmets with a favorite team's logo or a pic-
ture can be painted on the base of the clock from a photograph that is sent in. A set of wooden dominos along with a wooden carrying case is available. Rocking horses, either toy-sized or toodler-sized, can be made with a variety of stain options.
Bible covers are a big request, which can inmates have made.
The inmate sets a price on the item he has produced. When that item is delivered (by someone other than the inmate themselves) the money is collected and that amount is gives thed into the inmate's trust fund. This repeat this inmate more funds they can use to repeat this process of supply and demand.
One inmate said he has One inmate said he has supported himself for 11 years by making and selling items. That
gives him a sense of accomplishment that his gives him a sense of accomplishment that his
family does not have to send him money. All of the time spent in the craftshop is on the prisoner's free time. The normal job has to be complete first each day before he is allowed to go to the work area. Upon entering the shop, the inmate is patted down. Then each inmate is strip-searched every time they
leave the craftshop. When asked if this was humiliating, they all replied no because it is a small price to pay for doing something they love.
Each inmate has his own work area where his tools and supplies are locked up, since he has spent his own money on them. If he would his decision. The prison has never had trouble with tools
or other items leaving the craftshop and getor other items leaving the craftshop and
ting out into the general population. "The guys that have earned the right to come here don't want anything to jeopardize the time they get to spend in here, so they
make sure nothing leaves this room," Simmons said. "If something bad occurred in the craftshop, the prisoners know we would shut it down immediately and they do not want that to happen."

## Small schools fading away along with rural populations

BASSETT, Neb. (AP) - Twenty-
five miles off the main highway, deep five miles off the main highway, deep
in a cradle of sand dunes bound together by prairie grass, a one-lane
ribbon of asphalt southeast of town ends abruptly at a barbed-wire fence. Cattle roam on one side, and on the other sits a school that's in danger of
becoming a relic in this wide-open, becoming a relic in this wide-open,
north-central Nebraska region that is among the most sparsely populated in the country.
In teacher Nickie Ebert's class-
room, she tells a second-grade boy room, she tells a second-grade bo "Treat people the way you'd want to
be treated." She doesn't fight for his attention; only two other pupils are in attention; only two other pupils are in
her class - a kindergartner and a her class - a kindergartner and a working in the school's only other classroom, also has perfect attendance on this fall day: two girls - an eighth
grader and a fourth grader. grader and a fourth grader.
Those five children comprise the
total student body at the 120-year-old Pony Lake School.
Class photos in an album chronicle the school's past and may give a clue
to the future. to the future.
In 1988, there were 23 faces; 16 three years later; 14 in 1995 . going to close," Shafer said.
Shafer and many rural Nebraskans for years have watched people leave, businesses dry up and the number of farms and ranches dwindle. In some
places, small schools are among the places, small schools are among the
few remaining symbols of vitality and community identity, providing hope for the future while acting as
reminders of the past. An anomaly in reminders of the past. An anomaly in
some states, they remain a pillar of education systems in some, like Nebraska and Montana, that have
remote regions where cattle have long outnumbered people.
But populations in rural areas of those and other states are dipping to
levels where there are few, and somelevels where there are few, and some-
times no students to teach. A school in times no students to teach. A school in
the same county as Pony Lake shut the same county as Pony Lake shut
down this year when its attendance dropped to a lone student.
In Montana, small country schools are drying up like the state's droughtplagued pastures. About a hundred have closed over the last decade and
"the rate of decrease has accelerated" said Claudette Morton, director of the Montana Small Schools Alliance. When Kim Olind attended Alzada school in southeastern Montana in the late 1970s, there were about 20 kids. This year, for the first time, the school
didn't open."
"It's sad," said Olind, president of
the school board.

Montana has more one-room schools - commonly defined as those with just one teacher and the smallest subset of country schools than any other state in the country, according to Neenah Ellis, an author
and radio producer who spent a year researching one-room schools. Nebraska is second.
"Everywhere I went," Ellis said of her cross-country trip visiting small schools, "(closing) was either of great radar."
About 24,000 one-room schools
existed in 1959; 840 in 1984. Ellis
estimates about 300 remain.
Some small schools are fighting Some small schools are fighting
more than dwindling population. After years of debate about their plight, the Nebraska Legislature last year voted to dissolve Pony Lake and other elementary-only districts and merge them with adjoining K-12 districts. The law didn't close the
schools, but instead gave the boards of the larger districts that absorbed the elementary-only districts the choice of whether they should close.
Supporters of the schools reacted emotionally to passage of the law, and the districts will come back is in limbo. That's because the districts were
dissolved months before the dissolved months before the
November vote. Small-schools supNovember vote. Small-schools supthat doing away with the districts berore the vote violated their due agreed, citing the fact that supporters failed to get enough signatures to suspend the law. That decision was appealed and the state Legislature is
expected to revisit the controversial issue of whether to recreate the disSupporters of the merger argued the schools were too expensive, inefficient and K-12 boards should decide their fates. In some places, where
such schools exist closer to some alleged white families used them to segregate their children from Hispanics.
Ron Raikes, the state senator who introduced the controversial law, cited statistics showing some K-12 districts
in towns with large Hispanic in towns with large Hispanic popula-
tions had hundreds of students who spoke English as a second language while outlying elementary-only schools had few or none.
And U.S. Rep. Tom Osborne said during his unsuccessful bid for gover nor that he had seen "cases where the
cause of segregation has been cause of segregation has
advanced" by the small schools. Supporters tout the attention chil dren get in the tiny schools. But the attention can be expensiv
The average, per-pupil cost of edu-
cating students in Nebraska is cating students in Nebraska is rough cation department. By comparison, the per-pupil cost at Pony Lake was nearly $\$ 13,300$ last year.
Another school that recently closed in the same county had per-pupil costs of more than $\$ 18,000$
Raikes said there is no data to show that students in the small schools fare
any better academically than their urban counterparts.
Trudy Nolles, whose fourth-grade daughter Katie attends Pony Lake, is among a group of parents who are convinced their children excel because of the intimate learning envi-
ronments where teacher-to-student ratios are often several times lower than national averages, students are exposed to lessons for higher grade levels and sometimes help younge children learn.
I dourth-grader reading on (Katie) is grade level," Nolles said.
