Austh (AP) - The Texas Youth Commission ha scandalized agency, but a top official said more releases are needed to relieve problems related to understaffing and a high staff turnover.
The state's juvenile prison system population of about
4,700 inmates dropped by 650 between according to agency records obtained by the Houston
Chronicle. pretty significant number to have an impact overall," sai TYC Conservator Jay Kimbrough, who was appointed by Gov. Rick Perry to clean up the agency.
The commission announced in early April that it planned have completed their minimu The sand haven't caused any trouble behind bars. the move is part of a top-to-bottom investigation of agency policies amid allegations that surfaced in February that inmates were sexually and physically abused and employees who knew about the problems did nothing to stop them.
A state panel is also reviewing inmates who may have haid as many ances improperly extended. Officials have of the review.
The largest reduction in inmate numbers occurred at the Marlin Orientation and Assessment Unit, which saw its population cut by 172 inmates.
Kimbrough said that's not a surprise because Marlin is to send youths into the system since the abuse scandal broke,
The agency's halfway houses and contract care facilities also saw a significant drop with a combined reduction of 141 inmates.
TYC facilities housing more violent inmates have seen smaller declines in their inmate numbers. from its January count of 181
The facilities in Crockett and Corsicana, which hold mentally and emotionally unstable youths, saw a combined reduction of 43 inmates from their population of 464 in January.

The bill would require free or low-cost counseling with a certified mortgage counselor or a state-
licensed attorney with experience in mortgage lending. Counselors would study the conditions of the loan and make sure the borrower understands the condition. One potential problem with the bill is the availabil-
ity of certified mortgage counselors ity of certified mortgage counselors and lawyers with expertise in home lending. That's a problem that
should be worked out by the companies that make high-risk loans.
Mortgage counseling for those receiving risky
high-risk loans could help prevent foreclosures, which are on loans could help prevent foreclosures, which are on the increase in Texas and the country. As the implo sion of the subprime market proves, too many would ng what they're getting into. Any information that helps them is beneficial to them and to the lenders. Rodriguez said banking interests are not yet behind the bill because they fear losing business. But surely consumer protection should be paramount when it comes to home loans.
