Fear grips immigrant populace after Mississippi plant raid
LAUREL, Miss. (AP) --
A day after the largest singleworkplace immigration raid in U.S. history, Elizabeth
Alegria was too scared to Alegria was too scared to

worried about when she'd see her husband again. Nearly 600 immigrants
