But the Democrats could point to gains in special elections in Wisconsin, Montana and Massachusetts this year. However narrow the Democra-tic margins in 1969, Republicans won each of the three seats only last November by a margin of more than 60 per cent.

When the GOP elected President Nixon in November. It gained only four House seats and fell 26 votes short of winning control of the House. Now the Democrats have reclaimed three of those lost seats.

This will give the Democrats a 244 to 188 edge in the House. They control the Senate 57 to 43.

"These elections are not Isolated events," said House Democratic Leader Carl Albert. "I believe they represent a national pattern. They reflect a widespread dissatisfaction on the part of the American electorate with the performance of the incumbent administration. and the Republican party." Democrat Michael J. 

Groom (3-0) hosts the Mustangs (2-1) in what should prove a real all-out battle of a pair of good football teams.


