SAIGON (UPI) - President Nguyen Van Thieu said today South Vietnam is willing to discuss a cease-fire at the Paris Vietnam talks, but he ruled out any immediate, unconditional cease-fire which has been urged in some quar-

Thieu had said previously the Saigon government was willing to discuss any subject in Paris but his speech today concerning talks about a cease-fire was considered less negnative than his other statements on the subject. It was not seen as any reversal of policy, however.
