# General To Answer Charges In Scandal

ate investigators summoned Maj. Gen. Carl C. Turner to answer charges today he hushed up a service club scandal and used his office for personal gain when he was the Army's provost marshal gener-

Turner was fired one month ago by the Nixon administraa job he took after retiring as the Army's top police officer in November.

He has been accused of covering up an alleged conspiracy of career Army sergeants who drained U.S. service clubs around the world by "skimming" slot machines, stealing liquor by the case and

paying themselves extra salaries while on leave or hospitalized.

The Senate permanent investigations subcommittee entered its second week of open hearings on the service clubs

The subcommittee said it had evidence Turner used his position to obtain without cost

confiscated firearms from city police officials, and sold them for personal gain.

Turner's attorney has indicated his client will freely respond to subcommittee questions and not take the Fifth Amendment, although his testimony could be used against him in any later

criminal proceeding. Phillip R. Manuel, staff investigator for the subcommittee testified Monday Turner had been unable to account for 500 firearms he had obtained free from the Kansas City, Mo., and Chicago Police departments.

The confiscated arms-all shapes and varieties of rifles and hand guns-normally would have been destroyed, but police wanted to use the weapons for Army training and for display in U.S. Military Police museums

Instead, Manuel testified, Turner sold some of the guns to the Pine State Gun Shop of Fayetteville, N.C. Some of the weapons found their way into a five - ton illegal cache of firearms seized by police before they were shipped to Haiti, he told the subcommittee.


