





The Family Lawyer

Do-It-Yourself Lawyers It was a story to warm the heart of the common man. An indignant motorist, handling his own case, fought a traffic ticket all the way tothe state supreme court and won an acquittal.

In acting as his own lawyer he was within his rights There is no legal requirement that you must have an attorney to represent you in the courtroom. As long as you are of age and mentally competent, you have the right to plead your own

But the difficulties to be faced are formidable indeed. As the United States Supreme Court observed about a layman in

"He needs the aid of counsel lest he be the victim of overzealous prosecutors, of the law's complexity, or of his own ignorance or bewilderment." Nor is the court required to

guide the do-it-yourself lawyer through his difficulties. By and large, he is bound by the same basic rules as regular lawyers

"ignorance is rewarded." To test the success of doit-yourself lawyers, a study was made of thousands of personal injury claims in New York City. it showed that those who hired a lawyer collected almost 50 percent more money—after paying the lawyer—than those who did not.

Why should anyone want to try his own case? Reasons sometimes given are "I couldn't afford a legal fee" or "I didn't know any lawyers"

But those reasons apply far less today than ever before. There has been a vastpansion -still going on-in the availability of legal services. For those who cannot pay. free legal help is now offered at more than 800 Legal Aid o neighborhood OEO offices and defender organizations-an

increase of 200 in the last year. For those who can pay but don't know a lawyer, there are Lawyer Referral Service offices in more than 252 cities and towns. These agencies (or the local bar association) will arrange a try-out interview with a qualified attorney for a modest fee.

Anyone protecting his rights ought to explore these possibilitities before strking out on his own. As a federal judge warned:

"A party who tries his own case is like a man cutting his own hair -in a poor position to appraise what he is doing." A public service feature of the American Bar Association and the State Bar of Texas, by Will Barnard.

Court Assesses \$55,542 in Fines

A total of \$55,542 in fines was assessed in Pampa's Corporation Court during 1968. The figure includes fines in both traffic and criminal cases. Of the total, \$48,107 of the fines were collected and \$314 traffic fines and \$3,782.50 in criminal cases were served out

Sixteen hundred and sixtyfour dollars in traffic fines and \$1,675 in criminal fines were. suspended by the court.

The corporation assessed and collected \$3.096. 50 for overtime parking and \$1.137 for non-moving traffic violations during the first 11 months of

The report shows there were 2.467 convictions in traffic cases and 581 persons were found guilty in criminal cases in the city court. Fifty-two were found not guilty in traffic cases and 29 were found not guilty in criminal cases.

There were 2,449 persons found guilty on overtime parking charges and 436 for other non-moving violations. The parking report shows 5.318 cases were dismissed for courtesy to outof county offenders.
