The Doctor Says

By DR. W. G BRANSTADT Accidental Chokings

Largely Preventable Small children learn about various objects by putting them in their mouths. A sudden fit of laughing, crying or gasping may carry the object into the windpipe and cause choking, a common but frightening experience for both mother and child. Since infants who do not yet have their molars can't grind peanuts, popcorn or hard candy, they should not be given such items. The objects most commonly involved in choking attacks, however, are safety

An infant who sees his mother with a mouthful of pins naturally thinks the mouth is the place for them and imitates what he sees. Not only should safety pins be kept out of reach of an infant, mothers also should not set their children the bad example of holding pins in their mouths. When not in use, safety pins should always be closed.

Mothers of small children should bear in mind that each year peanuts, candy, watermelon seeds and other hard objects kill a great many babies. Most such accidents can be prevented by watching the baby more closely. In any case, if your baby starts to choke, don't panic. Don't pound him on the back because this may interfere protective clauses of the Bill of with his possibly successful efforts to cough the foreign body out. Don't prod his throat with your finger because this is likely to push the foreign body farther down his windpipe.

> If the initial choking stops, don't assume that the foreign body was swallowed. If it was small, it may have lodged in his lung where it will not cause any immediate symptoms. Call a physician who will arrange for X rays or a bronchoscopic examination pneumonia or a lung abscess.

A-Nosebleeds in children a-r e common, sometimes occurring as often as three or four times a week. Hot, dry air favors the formation of hard crusts in the nose. Then a light blow or picking the nose may start the bleednosebleeds in adolescence or sooner. Except in a congenital bleeder, they are not serious but when repeated more than twice a week they may cause secondary anemia. For this reason, if they persist, it is wise to consult a nose and throat specialist.
