

Says Nation to Seek Title of Peacemaker After Confrontations

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Richard Milhous Nixon became the 37th president of the United States today with a solemn committment to devote all of his energies to "the cause of peace among nations" and the healing of strident divisions among the American people.

To a nation suffering from "a crisis of spirit," the new Chief Executive offered a challenge to seize "not the cup of despair, but the chalice of opportunity,
