MOSCOW (UPI) - A top Soviet official abruptly cut off a cosmonaut telling newsmen how a gunman opened fire on a motorcade of space hero and government leaders enering the Kremlin.

# Twisters Leave Parts of Mississippi in Shambles

HAZLEHURST, Miss. (UPI)-A 40-mile stretch of southern Mississippi was a shambles of shattered homes, twisted power lines, demolished cars and treeblocked road today in the aftermath of a tornado that killed 29 persons and injured

hundreds of others. Twisters slammed across three counties at dawn Thursday, catching many of the residents in bed. Some awakened to horror.

Betty Gilmore, 15, felt her house moving and thought she was dreaming. She tried to get out of bed, but couldn't get her balance. Then she was thrown to the ground and looked up to see her four-room frame house floating downhill-sweeping her brothers and sisters as it went.

It came to rest in a mill pond.

Thursday near Dover, Tenn., along the Kentucky border, injuring one person and destroying four houses and several

was not hurt. Trees toppled, utility poles. snapped, gas and water mains burst, cars sun crazily like

"It was like the world was coming to an end," said Bessie Gilmore, 20, who later grabbed her daughter, Lynette, 3, and two young brothers from the

DAN B. CAMERON, PASTOR First Baptist Church RESPECT THE TIME OF OTHERS Luke 6:31


A sensitive approach to the Christian use of time is sure to consider our habits and the people around us. Here we can measure ourselves at sev-

We have noted that our Lord does not expect us to remake the world by our little selves. The immaculate mother who must do everything about the house because she can do it better; the meddling foreman who hasn't learned to keep hands off when he has given assignments to others; the perfectionist executive who delegates work but never cut his subordinates loose to use their own imagination—these, and all of us who hang on too tight to the other's share, might experience a bright new blessing if he lived by the Golden Rule.

One of the prime uses of the Golden Rule should be the proper respect for the time of others. How can we respect their time? I could make only a few suggestions. First, be punctual in your engagements. When we are late we rob the other person of valuable time. Since all our time is the heavenly Father's, then all our associate's time is His also. It is an awesome fact that whenever we are inconsiderate of those about us we may sin against the Lord's plan for other lives.

Second, another way we can respect the time of others is to be a good listener. Much of the gospel is given to Jesus' talk, but throughout the account of His life there are generous sprinklings of such phrases as "When Jesus heard" - "As soon as Jesus heard" and etc. Some of us need this art of our Lord for the time we spend with others. Often we sit on the edge of the sofa and fidget nervously until the other fellow has finished with his story. We wait for an opening. Or sometimes we don't wait. When he takes a breath, we seize the floor to tell what we heard about the matter, or who is going to win, or our opinion of the business before us.

Our Lord was not like that. He taught us to be considerate of others into practice.






