About 300 white and black students went on a rampage through a University of Houston building Monday, throwing chairs through cafeteria windows and tossing books and card files on the floor of the school's bookstore, resulting in between \$2,000 and \$3,000 in damages.

A leader of the Afro-Americans for Black Liberation (AABL) was credited with stopping the outbreak. At no time during the ruckus were uniformed police on







Being a Rookie Managers Test Pitchers In Exhibition Baseball

FT. LAUDERDALE (NEA) - The click of cleats on the cement floor, the palaver of the players and the reflexive pounding of fists into leather mitts: the sounds of a baseball locker room were silent now. Only a few New York Yankees remained. Ron Blomberg would be the last to leave; he is savoring every moment.

"I just sit here on the bench," he said, in front of his stall, "and stare at the names on the lockers. Joe Pepitone, Whitey Ford, Rocky Colavito. Oh, gosh, and Mickey Mantle, No. 7. Whew.'

The Yankees exhibition game against Baltimore had been called because of rain. Now Blomberg, after doing windsprints in the drizzle, had showered and was wearing a white turtleneck shirt, brown slacks, short brown hair with bangs Caesar-style and a bright, wide look in his light brown

Blomberg, a 20-year-old outfielder, was the top draft choice in the major leagues in 1967. He signed with the Yankees when he walked off the stage after graduation from an Atlanta High School. ("I can't say what the figure was," he said, "but newspapers had it anywhere from \$35,000 to \$150,000. Name a figure and they wrote it.")

"My biggest disappointment is not seeing Mickey Mantle play," he said. "He

earlier today, to pick up some things. I had never been this close to him and I watched him from here and I whispered to myself, 'Is that really you, Mickey?'

"I went over and shook hands with him. Oh, boy. He's not that tall, but I'll tell you, that's some kind of build. His arms are so big and, oh, his legs ,so power-

Blomberg, after his second professional season (he batted .251 with seven homers for Kinston of the Class A Carolina League in 1968 - "My worst year ever. But I learned a lot"), was invited to the Yankee training camp here. He expects to be farmed out again soon, this time to a Triple A club.

"Right now, it's like I'm in one world and all around me is another world," he said. "In a year or two, maybe I'll be part of that other world, too. Can you imagine, me at Yankee Stadium? If I'd ever hit a home run I'd just stand on




