SAIGON (UPI) - The Allies today accused the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese of 59 Buddha's birthday ceasefire violations that killed nine

persons and wounded 51. U.S. and South Vietnamese troops began their 24-hour standdown at 6 a.m. today, joining Communist troops whose 48-hour truce had begun at 7 ... n. Thursday. It was the 13th cease-fire of the Vietnam

Saigon government spokesmen reported 25 Communist violations between the time the guerrilla standdown started and the time the Allies quit offensive operations.

The announcement said the incidents killed four civilians and three village or hamlet officials while wounding 16 South Vietnamese soldiers and 18 civilians.

In the first eight hours of the Allies' truce, U.S. headquarters said, the guerrillas committed 34 violations, killing two Ameri-

can troops and wounding 17. Military spokesmen reported

at least 14 battlefield clashes during this period which they said killed 23 Viet Cong or North Vietnamese. Allied headquarters acknow-







If you swim in locations where there is no lifeguard, you should never swim alone and, if possible, see that at least one member of your party is trained in first aid and lifesaving.

Such animals as mice, raccoons, skunks, porcupines and bears may be attracted to your camp by the food you leave on the ground. Burn or bury your garbage, including paper plates, and keep food supplies covered, preferably in your car with the windows closed so the odor will not bring unwelcome guests.
