SAIGON (UPI) — U.S. B52 bombers dropped nearly 900 tons of bombs and Allied troops killed 168 Communists in an effort to break up a red drive against Tay Niny city, a key provincial capital, military spokesmen said today.

They were the heaviest B52 raid in Tay Ninh province northwest of Saigon since April 24 and followed a day of fighting around Tay Ninh city by U.S. infantrymen riding tanks and South Vietnamese paratroopers sweeping through







U.S. Open May Be When Yancey Turns

NEW YORK (NEA) -There are a few guys on the Professional Golfers Association tour who rip off calendar pages by watching Bert Yancey.

"Bert is a strange individual," says Frank Beard. "He doesn't care about money or winning everyday tournaments. The only thing he cares about is winning a major tournament - the Open or the Masters or the British Open or maybe the PGA- and you can see him start to get ready for one the Memphis Open for three of these tournaments a days before faltering with a

In the spring when azaleas bloom in Augusta, Yancey thinks Masters. He envisions Rae's Creek and Gene Sarazen's knickers and other such trappings. Other tournaments pass by in a blur, mere preliminaries to the showdown.

After the Masters comes the National Open and almost any of Yancey's friends will tell you these days it is imminent. A few weeks ago, he won the Atlanta Classic and then led

June 12, Champions Golf Club, Houston, Tex., coming

Everyone agrees that the prospect of a major tournament changes Yancey. The question that remains, however, is how.

"Just before a big tournament, he becomes more jovial," says Tom Weiskopf. While other guys become tense, Bert gets more relaxed - he's smiling out there."

"The only time you ever see him practice is a month before a big tournament,"

says Tony Jacklin, who, with Weiskopf, plays a practice round with Yancey every Tuesday.

Beard, a frequent bridge partner of Yancey's observes his change from another angle.

"It's nothing specific," he says. "Bert basically just changes his normal facade. He becomes more serious

and more tense. He does do some actual mechanical practice, but somehow, someway, he keys himself. He gets himself blocked out from the rest of the world and goes into this tournament as though it were

"And it's worked for him." Bert Yancey, 31, has remained something of an

yellow visor for years. Victim of a nervous breakdown, nine years ago while a cadet at West Point, Yancey drew most of his attention the wrong way despite a classic golf swing.

("I'd rather have Yancey's stroke than a license to steal.'' says Champions co-owner Jackie Burke.)

A tall, pleasant-looking fellow with blond-red hair, he became known as the guy who eliminated himself from the 1964 Open by stepping on a pieceof glass in a water hazard. Later, in 1967, he was struck by lightning while

sitting on a metal playing bridge during a raindelayed tournament.

Now, however, he has emerged as a fine player and serious competition for anyone. "The only thing I have to do now is make myself believe I deserve the Open," he says. "Last year it was as though I couldn't

convince myself of that." Yancey led the Open by five strokes at one point during the third round of last year's tournament. Then Lee Trevino buried him in the final 18 holes.






