# Pacifist Arranges Release Of Prisoners

PARIS (UPI)-American paclfist David T. Dellinger flew home Saturday announcing he had arranged for three U.S. war prisoners to be released by

North Vietnam within 10 days. The freeing of the prisoners was expected to improve the atmosphere of the Paris peace talks, which were marred by a new diplomatic clash between

the Viet Cong and the South Vietnamese government.

Dellinger, chairman of the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam. returned to New York after arranging technical details for the return of the three

Dellinger told newsmen after completing discreet talks with the Hanoi and U.S. delegations to the peace conference that the prisoners would be handed over to a group of American pacifists in Hanoi within 10 days .--

He clinched the deal with Hanoi's No. 2 delegate, Col. Ha Van Lau, after securing a piedge from the chief American negotiator, Henry Cabot Lodge, that the U.S. Army will not interfere with the prisoners' travel back to the U.S. The North Vietnamese have

complained that the U.S. Army has tried to intercept previously released prisoners at the earliest possible opportunity. aft their departure from







It is just as well we think, that a certain amount of skepticism and controversy is beginning to develop about the whole question of heart transplants. Certainly the practical, moral and philosophical issues involved are not susceptible to simple solution.

At first glance these medical advances would seem to be a boon to humanity, and perhaps that is the conclusion that should ultimately be drawn. In the meantime the problems and the doubts remain.

In the opinion of a number of medical men, heart transplants themselves are not a satisfactory answer to heart disease. Even if a great many more patients survived than have so far, it would continue to be difficult to match patient and donor. Many who could benefit from a transplant would perforce be denied it. Who is to get it? Who decides?



It is just as well we think, that a certain amount of skepticism-and controversy is beginning to develop about the whole question of heart transplants. Certainly the practical, moral and philosophical issues involved are not susceptible to simple solution.

At first glance these medical advances would seem to be a boon to humanity, and perhaps that is the equalision that should ultimately be drawn. In the meantime the problems and the doubts remain.

In the opinion of a number of medical men, heart transplants themselves are not a satisfactory answer to heart disease. Even if a great many more patients survived than have so far, it would continue to be difficult to match patient and donor. Many who could benefit from a transplant would perforce be denied it. Who is to get it? Who decides?

This problem has already been encountered with the scarce, costly kidney machines (they are externally operated). The ethical question of choice of patients and denial of others, in the circumstances of cost and scarcity, troubles thoughtful people.


