Nixon Visits Not So Friendly Pakistan

LAHORE, Pakistan (UPI)-President Nixon flew here today and called for a broad program of regional and bilateral projects in Asia as the best way of bringing peace and progress to the area. The statement appeared to be a plea for peace between India and Pakistan.

On his arrival Nixon was promptly reminded the relationship between the United States

and Pakistan no longer was as close as 16 years ago under the Eisenhower administration. Nixon promised to try to restore that close relationship.

The reminder came from Gen. Agha Mohammad Yahya Khan, 52, the new military president who has expanded ties with the Soviet Union and moved closer to Red China in mutual distrust of India with whom both have fought border

Nixon, who flew to Lahore from talks in New Delhi with Indian Prime Minister Indura Gandhi, stated once again the policy he had stated in the other Asian nations he has visited: "Asian hands must

shape Asia's future." Nixon, in one of several speeches during the day, listed six major reasons for his visit

that feeling makes possible." -"Second, a stable and cordial relationship must be built on a elear understanding by each of our governments of

the interests and viewpoints of the other."

-"Third. I want to stress the continuing interest of the United States in the progress of Pakistan and all of Asia . . . the United States will continue to give strong encouragement to Asian development."

-"Fourth, I wish to communicate my government's conviction that Asian hands must shape the Asian future. This is

to economic aid . . . its purpose is to encourage self-reliance. not dependence."

-"Fifth . . . governments are at their best when they look not just to the overall well being of the nation but to the opportunity of individual men, women and children. That is where the strength of a nation lies,"

"Finally, it is our hope that Asians will work more closely constructive bilateral and regional projects. The regional cooperation for development organization in which Pakistan participates with Iran and Turkey is one encouraging example of such activity.

"I mention all these points because I believe these policies represent the best way of bringing peace and progress to

The great musicians amaze their audiences with the power they have over their instruments, but behind the scenes have been countless hours of practice which the public never heard. So with the child of God, there must be hours of devotion alone with God for anyone who would be useful in His service and live a victorious life.

So necessary are private devotions that without them we can not make progress. Continued neglect of them will

result in spiritual downfall. Early each morning some time with the Word of God will provide food for the soul. This should be followed by giving ourselves to God in prayer - praying for our own advancement, then branching out for others until our supplications take in family, friends, the church, missionaries, fellow workmen and the whole world.

But don't let morning deprayer. At any hour of the day or night we may lift our hearts to God, right where we are, asking Him to guide us and maire us better Christians, to help with our task, to lead where He wants us to go, and to prepare us for every service He would have is perform. David said, "At midnight will I rise to give thanks unto Thee." There . is always an ear listening when we pray!

You may find that when you pray, there will flock to your mind a dozen things that should be done, and your thoughts may seem to be rambling in every direction, but if you will forget everything outside, enter into the closet of your heart and let other things go, you'll find God shutting you in with Himself, and you'll come out of this communion chamber with strength for service and praise in your heart for His goodness and mercy to you.
