Apollo 11 astronauts Neil A. Armstrong, Michael Collins and Edwin E. Aldrin Jr. rode the route of Lindy, Ike and MacArthur up Broadway to start a 20-hour day that would

canyons to a state dinner with President Nixon tonight in Los Angeles.

It was the public's first realglimpse of the space men since they returned from the flight that put Armstrong and Aldrin on the surface of the moon July 20. New Yorkers made the most of it with cheers, take them from the concrete, billowing tickertape and tons of

shredded paper and an outpouring of official oratory.

"We have honored many voyagers before-men who sailed around the world, men who flew alone across the ocean," said Mayor John Lindsay in City Hall ceremo-

"But today we honor three

men who forged the first link between the earth and the stars. . . for that victory New York thanks you and the world thanks you."

The sun bathed the city through its usual pall of smoke and haze and temperatures were in the 80's. Thousands of people began lining up hours before the astronauts arrived. Space was at a premium in the windows of the towering buildings that line the Broadway financial district.

Drums went bang, cymbals clanged and bugles blared away along the route. They weren't all in great tune and the echoes against the buildings jarred the ears, but it was all for the space heroes and a foretaste of noisy celebrations still to come. Next stop: the Windy City and a royal Chicago welcome.

American flags hung as a canopy from buildings along Broadway. And each street lightpole bore a small U.S. flag, an orange-and-white New York City flag and a dark-blue flag of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA).

"I've never seen so many cops," said 9-year-old Joe Cappolano Jr., of Huntington, W. Va., as his father jockeyed for space on the thickening

The hawkers were out as usual, selling souvenir pennants and buttons and chanting, "First men on the moon."

The President's proposal, outlined last week, would abolish the largest and most controversial welfare program, which provides payments to mothers and children, and replace it with a family assistance plan that would include the low-income worker as well as the unemployed.

It would provide that no family of four, for example, could fall below \$1,600 a year and that the same size family could earn up to \$3,920 a year and still be eligible for benefits. Larger families could receive larger benefits.

It would set a federal floor of \$65 a month payments to adults who are aged, blind and disabled; require the ablebodied, except mothers of preschool children, to register for work or job training, and give financial relief to the states.

Voters also favored issuing 200 million more in college tudent loan bonds to continue the Texas Opportunity Plan of aid to needy youngsters bent n higher education.

Elimination of deadwood from the state constitution met strong favor. So did payments to survivors of volunteer firemen. reserve or auxiliary police and other state or local government employes killed in line of hazardous duty.

On the other hand, voters were antagonistic toward four other proposed amendments on the August 5 ballot.

They overwhelmingly rejected pay raises for state legislators annual sessions of the legislature. They disapproved property tax exemptions for non-profit water supply corporations by a fairly strong margin and narrowly rejected lifting the constitutional interest rate ceilings on state bonds.

Defeat of the annual sessions amendment put an end to hopes of any legislators that another single-year, no-tax state budget can be passed in the current special session and accepted by Jov. Preston Smith.

TAX BILL TO SENATE-Now it's the Seante's week to wrestle with the tax bill.

House passed its \$341 million version of revenue raising to balance a biennial budget and sent it across the rotunda. From comments, it is an overstate ment to say senators don't like it but hearings are under way in an attempt to come up with an acceptable compromise and that won't be easy.

Here is what the House bill does (all levies effective January1); Raises the sales tax rate from

three to 3.5 per cent. Boosts the cigarette tax five

cents a pack, to 16 cents. Launches a new 3.5 per cent tax on telephone and telegraph auto repairs, appliance (except washing machines, dryers and refrigerators) and jewelry repairs, parking, laundry and dry-cleaning (except self-service coin-operated) and professional entertainment services. (Included in the latter would be admission charges to professional athletic contests, night clubs, dance halls, amusements parks and scenic attractions.)

Levies a 10 cent transactions tax on each sale or purchase of stocks, bonds, warrants and other securities, with few ex-

Cuts the gross receipts tax on telephone and telegraph companies from 2.5 per cent 1.9 per cent (which would reduce the industry's direct taxes about \$5.7 million per biennial fiscal period.)

City officials are angry because, while new sales and services taxes would be levied at 4.5 per cent rate in those municipalities which levy local option sales tax, they would get ione of added revenue...
