TEXT (II vor. 4:4; 1 Tim. 1:11)

INTRODUCTION....The Apostle Paul uses the expression "the glorious gospel." Why did he use this expression? Why is the gospel

I. It comes from God. The gospel that is presented in the New Testament is unlike any other religious message in the world. It's not earth seeking heaven, but heaven seeking earth. We all like to see a master craftsman at work; he views the problem he is presented with and then acts once and the job is done. So it is with God; He viewed the situation presented by the sinfulness of man and acted once and gave us all that was needed-the glorious gospel.

II. It is intended for all, without distinction. There are many things in this life that are restricted for a certain class, but thank God that the gospel is for all people. It doesn't matter how or what or who you are, the gospel






