Q-I am a woman, 62. For the past two years my hair has been falling out. Could this be caused by a lack of vitamins or by using hair

Q-My daughter, 39, is almost bald on the top of her head. Could the fact that she caused it? Would taking by the following chart: gelatin help her?

A-Smoking is being blamed for many ills but not for loss of hair. Gelatin is one of many things tried as a remedy for baldness but there is no evidence that it does any good.

Q-Baldness does not run in my family. Could harsh hair straighteners cause it?

and irritate your scalp, but they revenue of \$4.5 billion. don't cause baldness.

Q-What causes alopecia areata? Is there any cure for it? Will the hair come back

A-The cause of patchy bald spots is unknown but it is seen most often in highly nervous persons. It must be differentiated from ringworm of the scalp. In almost all persons with true alopecia areata, the hair eventually comes back. Meanwhile, massage and exposure of the involved areas to the sun or a sun lamp to blisters may be helpful.






