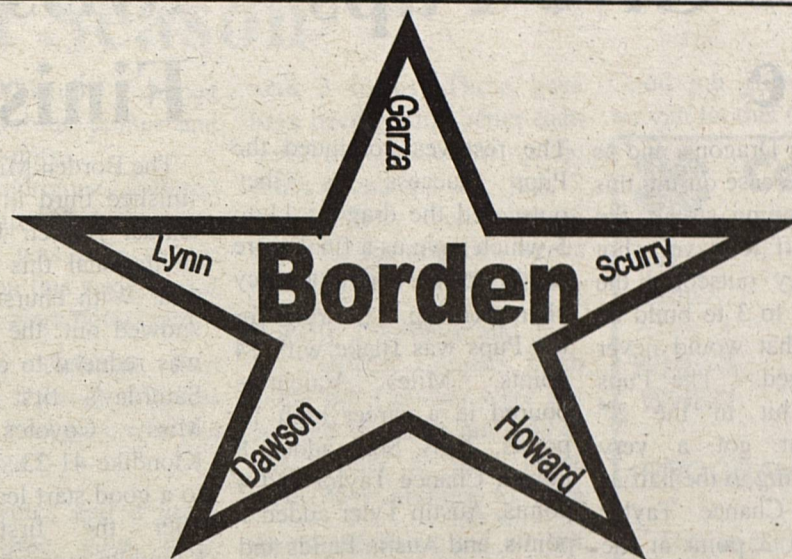

Coyotes End Season With Jayton and An 8-5 Record

The Borden Coyotes were defeated last Friday night in Merkel for the second time this season by the Jayton Jaybirds. The 8-5 Coyotes struggled all night as the Jaybirds seemed to dominate both sides of the ball to become the Quarterfinals champion.

The Coyotes dug themselves a hole early as the Jaybirds scored first, then the Coyotes fumbled the ball away to give the Jaybirds great field position for their second score. It was 14 to 0 when Michael Bullinger returned the kickoff 70 yards for the Coyotes first touchdown. Bullinger kicked the PAT good to make the score 14 to 8.

The Jaybirds scored again on a 4 yard run and then opted to pass the ball over for the one point PAT to make the score 21 to 8.

Early in the second period the Coyotes would score again on a 7 yard pass from Clint Chapman to Zane Williamson. The PAT kick

failed and the score was 21 to 14.

With 1:03 left in the second period the Jaybirds scored on a 5 yard pass, their PAT kick was good to take the score to 29-14.

The Coyotes put out a great effort to score again before the half was over to get to within 7 points of the Jaybirds. Quentin Shafer caught a 15 yard pass from Clint Chapman and ran into the end zone, Bullinger kicked the PAT good and the score at the half was 29 to 22.

The Jaybirds scored first in the third quarter on a 7 yard pass play, their PAT kick was good to make the score 37 to 22.

The Coyotes answered their score with a 55 yard catch and run from the brothers, Clint to Flynn Chapman. The PAT kick failed and the score was 37 to 28.

The Coyotes then struggled even more as they allowed the Jaybirds to score 5 times without answering with one of our own. Behind 44 points the Jaybirds attempted a one point PAT to end the game but the pass failed and the Coyotes were still alive.

On the Coyotes next play and with 3:59 left in the game the Coyotes scored the final touchdown of the game as Quentin Shafer scored from 38 yards out on a

Two Victories Give Pups Tourney Title

The Borden County Pups playing host to a field of 6 teams in the 2nd Annual Borden County Invitational posted to very convincing victories to manage a tie breaking advantage to garner the Tourney Championship for the 2nd straight year. The Pups held the tie breaker advantage over Loraine as the Pups held a positive 30 points (margin of victory no more than 15 points) to Loraine's positive 22 points to take the tourney crown. Other teams competing in this years tourney were Hermleigh, Klondike, Sands, and Dawson. The Pups played the Klondike Cougars to start the tourney, and jumped out to yet another quick start as they took an 11 to 2 advantage into the 2nd period. The Pups built as much as a 17 to 2 lead before the Cougars cut the lead to 17 to 7 heading into the locker room. The Cougars continued their good fortunes and solid shooting in the 3rd period to cut the lead to 7 points at 25 to 18 heading into the 4th quarter, but the Pups used some very solid defensive play and very unselfish play to regain their first quarter form and in fact duplicate the first quarter results to outscore the cougars 11 to 2 to give the pups a 36 to 20 victory. Scoring for the Pups in this contest was Tony Soto with yet another career high of 16 points, Miles Valentine added 8 points, Blake Turner scored 10 points and Chance Taylor rounded out the scoring with 2 points. Also contributing to the victory was Austin Fields, John Hensley, Austin Tyler and Michael Froman.

In the final contest of the tournament, the Pups played

the Dawson Dragons, and as has been the case during this 4 game winning streak, the pups got off to a very hot start as they outscored the Dragons 15 to 3 to build an advantage that would never be challenged. The Pups slowed a bit in the 2nd quarter, but got a very exciting ending to the half as 7th grader Chance Taylor banked in a 3 point at the buzzer to give the Pups a comfortable 24 to 7 lead at intermission. The Pups continued to extend their lead in the 3rd period as they again outscored the dragons 9 to 3 and gave the pups a 33 to 10 lead going into the 4th period. The Pups opened the 4th period with the 4th 3-pt basket of the game as Austin Tyler added a three to Chances and Blake Turners two in the first half to extend the lead, and allow the Pups to play their reserves the remainder of this contest.

Pups Wallop the Wildcats

The Borden County Pups extended their winning streak to three games as they cruised to a victory here Monday night against the visiting Westbrook Wildcats. The Pups dressed 9 young student/athletes for this contest, and all nine young Pups scored in this lopsided victory. The Pups wasted little time in putting this game away, as they outscored the visitors 17 to 0 in the opening stanza. Four of the five starters scored in this opening period as Blake Turner scored 5 of his career high 17 points in the period. Eighth graders, Miles Valentine, John Hensley and

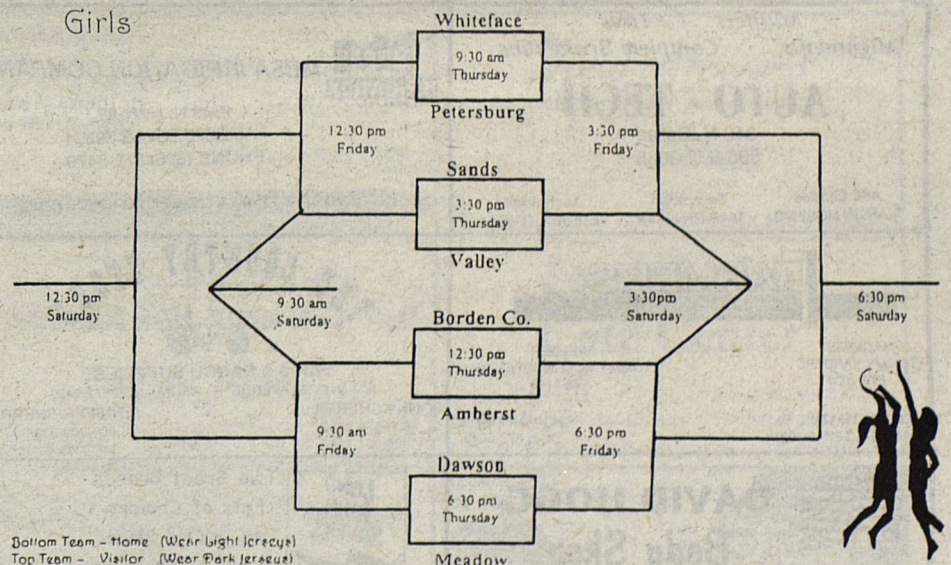

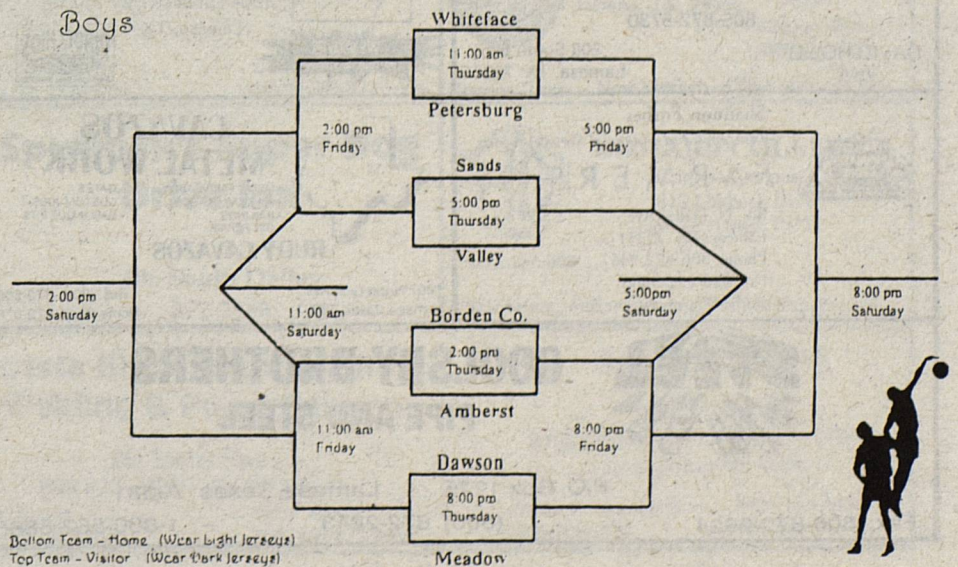

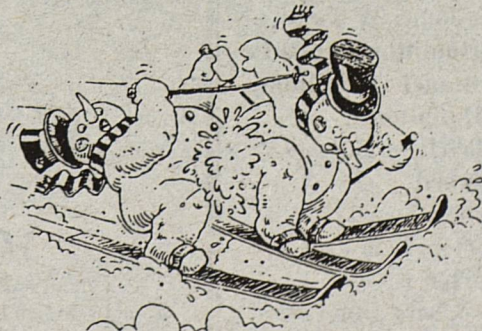
