SAIGON (UPI) - South Vietnamese troops killed 251 Communists in a two-day tank, air and artillery drive that military sources today said spilled into neighboring Cambodia.

The Saigon command said 20 government soldiers were killed in the fighting in South Vietnam's Duc Hue district, which lies along the Cambodian border 35 miles north of Saigon. Command spokesman Lt.

Col. Le Trung Hien denied, however, reports by the sources that government troops crossed into Cambodia "We did not chase them

Nixon also promised new action soon to stimulate the slumping housing industry.

Several Senate Democrats are fighting to re-impose Nixon's wageprice control authority, but their effort appeared to be faltering. One blow came Tuesday when House Speaker Carl Albert said that if Nixon couldn't make the old controls work, he shouldn't be given new authority

Pushing for new control authority were Sens. Edmund S. Muskie, Maine; J. Bennett Johnston Jr., La. and Adlai E. Stevenson III, III.







By LEROY POPE **Business Writer** NEW YORK (UPI) - The automobile graveyard, a dismal feature of the American landscape for nearly 40 years, is fast disappearing.

The new electric furnace process of making steel in smaller mills uses virtually all scrap as the raw material, and junked cars make the best scrap.

As recently as 10 years ago, automobile cemeteries were growing in the United States and many other countires. The cost of transporting and recycling junked cars exceeded the value of the metal that could be extracted from them.

In some European countries short of land it even became fashionable to load junked automobiles on ships and dump them in the sea. This aroused protests from fishermen and ecologists who said the corroding metal polluted the ocean

few kinds of steel to serve the needs of local markets, changed everything. These little mills are computer controlled. The computer is programmed to give the mill manager an accurate analysis of the scrap content in the automobiles. refrigerators and other

junked steel objects he melts down. The computer also tells him how much pure metallic alloys he must add to get the kinds of new steel he wants

According to Ogden Corporation's Luria Bros. subsidiary, perhaps the nation's biggest scrap dealer, the electric furance sector of the industry. spurred by the rise of the minimill, produced 18.2 per cent of the nation's steel last year. It is expected to produce at least 25 per cent by 1980.

While the mini-mills use all scrap as raw material. larger electric furnace mills use combinations of scrap and new iron ore. Mills using the basic oxygen process, which made about 55 per cent of the steel output last year, use only 25 per cent scrap and 75 per cent new ore. The old-fashioned open hearth mills, which still make

around 27 per cent of the steel, use half scrap and half ore. The price of steel scrap went sky-high as the minimills and other electric furnace steelmaking

expanded in recent years. But within the past few weeks, the scrap price has broken by \$4 to \$16 a ton in the important Philadelphia and Chicago markets. A small drop in the nation's overall steel output probably caused the fall in scrap prices. A spokesman for Ogden's Luria Division said he thought the break in scrap prices may be of national importance, considering the tightness of u.s. supplies of domestic and imported iron ore. It means, he said, that making steel largely from scrap will be

This deal was played in the National Championships of 1961. Of the 13 times it was played, 12 South declarers arrived at a six - spade contract - and each of them finessed against East for the spade queen. The reason was a simple one.

After winning his heart king. West led the heart ace. East discarding a diamond as South ruffed. Each South declarer now realized that the appearance of a nine card suit in West's hand was a reality that had more practical significance with regard to the situation at hand than out - of - context mathematical probabilities: and that West, with but four cards in clubs, spades, and diamonds. did not figure to have the doubleton or tripleton queen of spades.

So, after trumping the second heart lead, each declarer led a spade to dummy's king. A spade was then returned and each declarer finessed his jack when East followed with the spade four. The ace of spades then felled East's queen, and that was that. If one were to take the East - West cards, reshuffle them. and give East thirteen





IN CRIMINAL PLOT White House Transcripts **Show Nixon Not Involved**

Wed., May 1, 1974

WASHINGTON (UPI) -The White House said Tuesday that "not once does it appear" in transcripts of Watergate conversations that President Nixon was ambiguous, not once does it engaged in a criminal plot to, obstruct justice.

In issuing a 50-page summary "white paper." the White House launched a full-fledged attack on John W. Dean III, fired one year ago today as presidential counsel. Much of the document dealt with Nixon's Sept. 15, 1972, and March 21, 1973, conversations with Dean, who later became the President's chief accuser.

The summary was presented to substantiate Nixon's assertion Monday night that his release of 1,200 pages of the transcripts would clear him of any involvement in Watergate and would "tell it all

In reference to the Sept. 15 conversation, the day the original seven Watergate indictments were handed down, the summary says that Nixon told Dean:

"But the way you have handled all this seems to me has been wery skillful. putting your finger in the leaks that have sprung here and have sprung there.

The white paper said Nixon made the statement "in the context not of a criminal plot to obstruct justice as Dean alleges, but rather in the context of the politics of the matter.

Dean testified at the Senate Watergate hearings last summer Nixon in that conversation had congratulated him for containing the investigation of the Watergate break-



Asbestos Fibers Hazardous To Health

U.S. Department of Labor has alerted industry and labor to a new-found source of hazardous exposure to asbestos fibers.

Labor John H. Stender, who heads the Department's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), said his agency has learned that many spackling and taping compounds used to cover seams in dry-wall joints contain asbestos. exposure.

Employes sanding joints smooth before painting may expose themselves to three to 13.7 asbestos fibers per cubic centimeter of air. **OSHA's** asbestos health standard limits employe exposure to five fibers per cubic centimeter, on an 8-hour time weighted average.

OSHA officals caution that many employers and employes, particularly in the home - building industry, may be exposed to unacceptable levels of chrysotile asbestos.

Asbestos is one of five toxic substances (the others

"My gripe is about the way American automobile manufacturers design the bodies of their cars so the wheels set out from under the fenders and throw everything that is on the road up along the sides of the car instead of up under the fenders. My personal experience has been with 1967, 1969 and 1973 Chevrolets.

When the roads were wet or have had slush, salt etc., on them, a short drive of five to 10 miles and both sides of the car look as though they have been sprayed. Where a side rear view mirror is on a car the spray from the front wheels hits the mirror and in a very short time the door glasses are completely covered, obstructing one's side view.
