## Can Epileptics Play In Sports?

| By G.C. THOSTESON, M.D. <br> Dear Dr. Thosteson: My on, 13, has grand mal son. 13. has grand mal epilepsy, but with medicaion his seizures are very well controlled. He has not had one now for at least a year and half. <br> He is a very active boy and I would like to know what-kind-of sports are sale for such a child? A friend told me that this can be outgrown. Is this possible? <br> -Mrs. L.F.L. <br> In a case as well controlled as your son's, almost any sport is allowable, but l suggest he start with the less violent ones - tennis, golf, baseball, swimming. But as to swimming, he should NEVER swim alone, and a swimming coach or buddy should be aware that he is epileptic, no matter how remote the chance of a seizure. <br> It is risky to predict that epilepsy can be outgrown. While that is not impossible in some cases, it seldom happens that way, and continued medication is the only course I recommend: Here's an added thought, however. Periods of low blood sugar have been associated with seizures, so | a prote in snack (to ward off any possible dropinn-blood sugar) before physical activity makes sense. <br> Muscular activity, you see, can lower the blood sugar. Protein, which is converted slowly into blood sugar.? provides a slow. steady release of sugar as a guard against a sudden drop. <br> Participatión in sports. however, is desirable when seizures are well controlled. It is. indeed, part of the psychological help that epilepsy patients shoufd epilepsy patients shouid have, to promote the sense of being normal. For too long in the past epileptics have not been treated normally as they should. <br> Dear Dr. Thosteson: I had an operation to remove my Fallopian tubes and most of one ovary but still have one good ovary and get my menstrual period every three weeks.
