

CHIP Insurance Applications Now Available

Insurance applications are now available in the Superintendent's office of Borden County ISD and the Borden County Judge's office for low cost policies moderate for income families.

The Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), is unique partnership federal between the government, the State of Texas and local communities designed to provide health insurance to hard-working families that do not have access to affordable group health insurance.

The program, which has annual premiums of \$18 per month to \$15 per year, depending on the family's gross income, has unbelievable benefits and covers every child in the family. Families with incomes as high as \$4,000 can still qualify for the program.
