trees this year. despite higher prices. Wholesale prices for live trees are
about 5 per cent higher than last year. according to John Koch, a Birdsboro. Pa.. grower and president of the Na -
Lional Christmas Tree Association. And American Tree \& Wreath. the nation slargest maker of artificial trees,
says retail prices for its products ar about 6 or 7 per cent above 1975 levels. an artificial one is a matter of personal preference. The artificial trees cost
more, but they can be used year after
year and may. year and may work out to be cheaper in the long run. They are easier to handle,
