Local officials who were elected to county offices during the November general election took their oaths of office Thursday morning, January 2, 2003 in the District Courtroom of Borden County Courthouse. Shown repeating their oaths are (left to right) Justice of the Peace Jane Jones, District Clerk Joyce Herridge, County Treasurer Kenneth Bennett, County Commissioner, Randy Adcock and Borden County Judge Van York. The oaths were administered by Billy Gannaway, Borden County Sheriff. Jana Underwood was also sworn-in as County Deputy Clerk by County Clerk Joyce Herridge. Newly elected commissioner, Joe Belew was unable to attend this ceremony but was sworn in on January 6th, 2003 by Judge Van York. Adcock and Belew were elected to the commissioners' posts previously held by retiring Larry Smith, Precinct No. 2 and Hurston "Buck" Lemons, Precinct No. 4.

Adcock, Belew take Office

Two new Borden County Commissioners were among the seven local officials sworn into office during a brief ceremony, in the District Courtroom at the Borden County Courthouse.

Randy Adcock and Joe Belew repeated the oaths of office as new county commissioners for Precincts No. 2 and No. 4, respectively. Adcock replaced retiring

Girls Alone in 1st Place; Boys Tied for Second

BHS Basketball Action continues for Coyotes, Lady Coyotes

Both BHS basketball teams remain in the thick of the playoff race after three district games.

The boys fell to Grady January 7, but overcame a ten-point deficit to defeat Dawson Friday night in Gail, 43-37.

The league-leading Wildcats had their hands full with the Coyotes as BHS stayed even after one quarter and then trailed by only a 25-19 margin at half-time.

Second-half play saw Grady outscore the visitors by seven to take the 48-35 district win.

Sophomore Ben Griffin led the Coyote offensive attack with 10 points, followed closely by Talin Pepper who chipped in nine.

T.J. Sharp added 8 while Shane Tarleton, Kyle Pinkerton, and Adam Carter finished out the scoring for

the Coyotes (4, 2, 2 respectively).

Friday night's district home opener gave Borden County fans some idea of the Coyotes' tenacity as Coach Richey's guys outscored Dawson 15-5 in the final quarter to take the come-from-behind win against a previously unbeaten (district record) Dawson team.

In the fourth quarter alone, the Coyotes shot 5-of-6 from the field and were perfect at the free throw line with a 5-of-5 performance.

With 5:53 in the third quarter, BHS was down by 10 points, 28-18. A lack of offensive rebounding gave Dawson some unanswered chances, which they converted on three consecutive possessions.

Then the Coyote defense took over and caused three steals and pulled down five

defensive rebounds that led to baskets on the other end.

The 13-4 run at the end of the third quarter and start of the fourth gave BHS the momentum for the remainder of the contest as the Coyotes upped their district record to 2-1.

With all players scoring and three in double-figures,

the Lady Coyotes took a convincing win over Grady, 76-27, January 7 at Grady.

The game was never in doubt as BHS jumped out to a 23-5 first-quarter advantage and just continued to pour it on.

Scoring for the Lady Coyotes were Bobbie Kempf (14), Micah Hensley (12), Menda James (10), Jami Gass (8), Carol Arellanos (8), Pati Rodriguez (8), Kyliya Culp (7), Shayla Gass (7), and Dalene Kempf (2).

Full-court pressure defense once again was key to the girls' third district win of the season against Dawson Friday night.

Another area that had to have pleased Coach Kevin James was the rebounding—the Lady Coyotes had 10 boards alone in the first quarter.

Dawson managed to stay within distance, however, due to a 4-of-15 shooting performance from the field early on and trailed at half-

time, 22-12.

After the intermission, BHS returned to the floor on a mission and stole the ball nine times in the next eight minutes of play, converting those turnovers to go on a 17-5 run in the third quarter.

The girls continued using their fundamentals to perfection as rebounding on both ends in the fourth quarter kept Dawson from getting close as BHS took the 53-28 win, their third consecutive district victory.

The girls started with a 9-8 first quarter lead.

Ana Arellanos started off the second quarter with a basket underneath after taking a pass from Lindsey Stamper to make it an 11-8 margin with 4:27 remaining in the half.

On the next Lady Coyote possession, Danelle Copeland tossed it inside to Stamper who put it in for two more BJH points.

With just a minute to play in the quarter, it was Copeland's turn to shoot underneath and score. Becky Dobyms found Copeland on the assist.

Arellanos's bucket with :11 gave the Lady Coyotes their 17-13 lead at intermission.

With fresh legs, the girls

returned and continued to dominate.

Kalli Poole grabbed three consecutive defensive rebounds to bring the ball back to the other end.

Stamper, taking the Arellanos screen, rolled around the left side of the lane for two more points to give BJH its first points of the second half.

Poole then followed with a field goal off of Stamper's assist, and the lead increased to 21-15 at the 3:01 mark of the third period.

Poole's put-back on an offensive board ended the scoring in this quarter as the Lady Coyotes held a 26-17 cushion.

The final period saw Sands pull to within seven points, but the visitors would get no closer as BJH had fields goals from Christina Soto, Stamper, and Poole to clinch the win.

If the first quarter could have been better, the jr. high boys' team would have made this a closer game than the score indicates.

cooperation with Borden County ISD.

When Lemons came into office he and Smith supported the purchasing of the second ambulance for Borden County along with the Borden County school system for the welfare of all of Borden County residents.

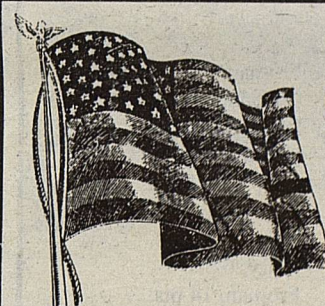
